# D-1 Wild Wise Sooke - Debbie Read

Debbie Read, representing Wild Wise Sooke, provided a PowerPoint Presentation outlining the goals and history of the program. Wild Wise's general approach to reducing wildlife conflict is to educate residents on managing attractants, including fruit trees and garbage. Ms. Read shared statistics on bear and cougar related calls to the Conservation Officer, as well as the numbers of animals who have had to be destroyed over the past few years.

# Council discussion:

 Statistics show the program is working, as conflicts are reduced and the number of animals destroyed is decreasing.

# D-2 Transition Sooke – Jeff Bateman

Waste Management Bylaw

Jeff Bateman, representing Transition Sooke, provided a PowerPoint presentation and outlined a proposal for a waste management bylaw that would restrict residents to putting their waste receptacles at the curb no earlier than 5:00 am on collection days. Council discussion:

- Possibility of working with private sector to manage quicker pick up times.
- Discussion of ways to deal with enforcement and education.

Staff Sergeant Jeff McArthur provided a verbal overview of the Sooke RCMP detachment, including current member strength and 2016 case files to date. The detachment is still

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waiting to fill an additional Constable position, as federal letters of approval have delayed the process.

Staff Sergeant McArthur also spoke regarding Sooke's Victim's Services program and the need for additional municipal funding to cover operating costs. Costs are to be shared 50/50 between municipal and provincial bodies, with Juan de Fuca Regional District responsible for approximately 37% of the municipal portion. A formal written request for additional funds will be sent shortly from the Sooke Transition House as they administer funds for the program.
