2019 RECRUIT CLASS COMPLETES EXTERIOR FIRE FIGHTER CERTIFICATION

Our 2019 Recruit Class continues to progress. On March 10, all members completed the practical and written components of their Exterior Firefighter certification. This included a day of vehicle, dumpster and propane tank fire simulations at the Otter Point Training Center – their first opportunity to feel some heat! The recruits continue their training with Interior Firefighter skills, culminating in two days of practical evolutions fighting structural fires as they progress towards graduation in May.



SOOKE FIREFIGHTERS BATTLE FULLY-INVOLVED COMMERCIAL STRUCTURE FIRE

In the late afternoon of February 17, Sooke firefighters responded to a commercial structure fire in the Saseenos area. On arrival, the structure was heavily involved and a defensive strategy was adopted, ensuring adjacent structures were protected and damage was limited to the building of origin. Assisted by mutual aid departments from Metchosin, East Sooke, and Otter Point, and an excavator from a local operator, crews worked for many hours – eventually placing all apparatus back in service in the early morning hours on February 18. Investigations, in cooperation with insurance agencies and RCMP, continued for several days afterwards.

The course is a key component of the Fire Officer 1 program and a very important stepping stone towards effectively filling the Duty Officer and Company Officer roles.
