### 2019 MENTORS PAIRED WITH PROBATIONARY FIREFIGHTERS

Applications have been submitted and are in the review stage for the first team of Sooke Fire Rescue Department recruit mentors. This new program sees each new Fire Fighter paired with a seasoned veteran from our volunteer ranks throughout their Recruit and Probationary phases. Mentors will help guide and support our newest additions as they navigate their first year in the department and the Fire Service. Pairs will be assigned based on station assignments, and personal fit.

### **RECRUIT OPEN HOUSE SCHEDULED FOR JUNE 23**

June 23<sup>rd</sup> will see 2019's first Recruitment Open House of the year. The event, running from 10am – 1pm at Station 1, will offer opportunities for potential recruits to learn more about Sooke Fire Rescue Department and to experience some of the skills and activities common to the fire fighter role. Attendees will have the opportunity to try hose handling and nozzle control, feel what it's like to wear bunker gear, tour the trucks, operate auto extrication tools, experience a high-angle rope rescue simulation, and even breath from Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus. Applications will be available and department personnel will be on hand to answer questions. There will be hot dogs and beverages available. Those interested are encouraged to bring family members for the experience.

## COUNCIL APPROVES NEW APPARATUS FOR STATIONS ONE AND TWO

Sooke's new Council has acknowledged the need to begin replacement of the aging fleet at Sooke Fire Rescue Department, with the approval of a new Engine and two new Utility vehicles. Production of the new Engine has been awarded to Hub Fire Engines – Capt. McCrea and DC Barney have completed a set of pre-build meetings in Abbotsford, BC, and expect final delivery by July 1, 2020. The utility vehicles, which will see one assigned to Station 1 and the other to Station 2, should be in service by end of summer 2019.
