#### 10. PUBLIC HEARINGS AND RELATED BYLAWS

#### 10.1. Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 726 (600-67), 2018

The Head of Planning presented an overview of the proposed amendment to the Sooke Zoning Bylaw to bring it into compliance with the recently amended Official Community Plan. The amendments permit applications for Temporary Use Permits for the continuation of historic non-conforming non-residential uses in the Gateway Residential land use area.

#### **Council Discussion:**

- Confirmation that the change would allow Council the opportunity to consider applications, it would not be an automatic approval process.
- The District enforces their bylaws on a complaint driven basis and under the direction of Council.

• Clarification that 'Permanent Structure' does not include parking, surface grading or hard landscaping.

Mayor Tait read a written statement advising that any person who believes their interest in the property to be affected by the proposed bylaw would be given a reasonable opportunity to be heard and have their written submission presented at the Public Hearing.

Mayor Tait called the Public Hearing to order at 7:24 p.m.

#### **Public Submissions:**

- <u>Ellen Lewers</u>, 5526 Sooke Road, is opposed to the amendment requesting that the previous *Official Community Plan* amendment be revoked and that the Zoning Bylaw be denied, as she views these changes to be assisting a business. Mrs. Lewers expressed her concern that other non-conforming businesses in the Gatewood Residential area were not released to the public.
- Gail Hall, 2517 Sooke River Road, stated her opposition to the amendment and expressed her disappointment in Council's decision to move forward a change to support a nuisance property.
- Richard Lewers, 5526 Sooke Road, spoke in opposition of the amendment and conveyed his concerns with living next door to an industrial business, in a residential area.
- <u>Derrek Lewers</u>, 5526 Sooke Road, provided a presentation and expressed his
  dissatisfaction with the proposed amendment. Mr. Lewers delivered an
  overview of his concerns regarding the changes to the *Sooke Zoning Bylaw*,
  temporary use permit application process and provide his personal
  experiences living next to an industrial business.
- <u>Jennifer Smith</u>, 2608 Quartz Drive, stated her opposition to the amendment.

The Public Hearing was closed at 8:17 p.m.

#### **Council Discussion:**

- The temporary use permit process will allow for commercial and industrial business to use the pre-existing application form.
- Concerns with businesses currently operating, legal non-conforming versus illegal non-conforming.
- Once in affect any changes to an existing business will require an application to be reviewed by Council.
- Confirmation that temporary use permits will provide a solution until a fulsome review of the *Official Community Plan* is completed.
- Each application will be reviewed by Council case-by-case.
- Desire to ensure the District is continually assessing the needs of a growing community and revaluating the constraints on a regular basis.

#### 8.1. Sooke Economic Development Group - Doug Wittich

Doug Wittich, representative for the Sooke Economic Development Group, presented an overview of elected official remuneration and highlighted that the District of Sooke was compensated lower than other similar sized municipalities. Mr. Wittich noted that during the election the Sooke Economic Development Group met with each candidate running for a position on Council and it was conveyed that the workload and expectations were heavy with minimal compensation. In combination with the removal of Federal Tax (one-third tax exemption) for elected officials, the impact is heavier as elected officials will be making even less in remuneration. The group recommended that Council consider increasing their remuneration to adjust for the removal of the tax exemption which may encourage future members of the community to run for Council without the worry of lack of compensation.

# Sookarama - Sooke Lions Club - Danny Willis Councillor Beddows left the meeting at 9:02 p.m. declaring a conflict as he is a member of the Sooke Lions Club. Danny Willis, representative from the Sooke Lions Club, inviting the District to partner with the Sooke Lions Club for the Sookarama trade fair at the cost of \$2000. The funds will assist in the costs of the venue, SEAPARC Leisure Complex, and District of Sooke will be advertised as sponsor of the event. Mayor Tait suggested the club apply for a Community Grant and if they are not successful, return to Council to request sponsorship. Councillor Beddows returned to the meeting at 9:05 p.m.

The Sooke Lions Club presented a plaque to the District of Sooke in appreciation for co-hosing the RCMP Musical Ride 2018 event.

#### 9. PUBLIC QUESTION AND COMMENT PERIOD

The following member of the public addressed Council:

- <u>Britt Santowski</u>, Sooke Resident, spoke in support of Item No. 11.4. AVICC Resolution Submission, as currently the District is limited to printed newspaper and there are other mediums available.
- Gail Hall, Sooke Resident, spoke to Item No. 11.5. Grant Application-Multi Sport Court Box with concerns regarding associated costs of rehabilitation to the property at Sunriver.
- Eric Boucher, Sooke Resident, spoke to Item No. 12.1. *Parks & Trails and Transportation Master Plans-Open Houses,* suggesting that the District align their planning with the highway 14 realignment.

#### 11. REPORTS REQUIRING ACTION

#### 11.1. ALR Exclusion - 7166 West Coast Road

The Planner I provided a presentation and overview of an application requesting exclusion from the Agricultural Land Reserve (ALR) for the property located at 7166 West Coast Road (PLN01391).

Mayor Tait invited members of the public to speak to the proposed ALR exclusion.

#### **Public Input:**

- Ms. Carlsen, representative for the property owner, spoke to the rational behind the owners request to remove the property from the ALR. Specifically poor soil quality, drainage issues created by lack of buffering of surrounding developments and that the financial burden of the property has exceeded the capacity of the current owner.
- <u>Derek Lewers</u>, 5526 Sooke Road, requested clarity regarding the Agricultural Land Commission (ALC) comments on the Technical Industrial (TI) overlay on this property. As well noting his concerns with the absences of adjustment to the OCP align with the comments of the ALC.
  - Staff clarified that the TI overlay on this property has no force and affect, as per the ALC comments in 2010.
- <u>Mary Johnson</u>, 6808 Pascoe Road, expressed opposition to removal of this
  property from the ALR, encouraging Council to support the protection of
  agricultural lands the community.

 <u>David Bush</u>, 19 Dallas Road, encouraged the removal of the property from the ALR as it is no longer commercially viable as a farm. Mr. Bush suggested the removal recoup losses after decades of trying to operate as a farm.

The Corporate Officer informed Council that a response can be submitted without an endorsed recommendation.

#### **Council Discussion:**

- Concerns surrounding storm water run off from neighboring developments can
  not be confirmed as this is not a development application and water
  accumulation is not being addressed.
- Trust in the process as the ALC are the experts.

PLN01391 at 7166 West Coast Road.

- Effort should be made to ensure farm lands are maintained.
- Current commercial agriculture may not work, but this location could be used for future farming.
- This property is not currently included in the sewer specified area.
- A report will be provided to Council from the ALC once their review is complete.

- The deposit requirement will secure the chassis and ensure if the costs escalate after contract is awarded the price is firm until delivered.
- Funding received as cost recovery from the forest fire participation will not be used towards this purchase, as these will fund a number of smaller capital purchases.

#### 11.3. Park Washrooms Award

Engineering Technologist provided an overview of the written staff report requesting a contract be awarded for the supply and installation of an accessible vault style two-stall washroom facility in John Phillips Memorial Park. There is currently an archaeological review underway for Whiffin Spit which has delayed the washroom upgrades.

#### **Council Discussion:**

- The facility will be located at the bottom of the staircase from the municipal hall parking lot, near the trees.
- A 2-stall washroom is more cost effective than the purchase of 2 single units.
- Councillor McMath was opposed to a single facility and desired funding be used to purchase 2 single stall facilities to decrease the overall cost.
- Desire to maintain the rock facade on the exterior of the building.
- Water servicing to the area will be completed once the 2019 budget is approved, and then a water foundation will be installed.

#### 8. PUBLIC QUESTION AND COMMENT PERIOD

Council heard from the following members of the public:

- <u>Laura Lemieux</u>, Sooke resident, spoke regarding Item 10.6. *Council Remuneration Options*. Ms. Lemieux chaired the Council Remuneration Committee in 2008 for the District of Sooke and encouraged Council to follow a similar, formal process once again.
- Marilyn Erickson, Sooke resident, spoke regarding Item 10.1. 5154 Sooke
  Road Freedom Mobile Telecommunications Tower. Ms. Erickson stated her
  opposition to the tower based on decreased property values, impeded
  sightlines, and health and safety concerns. Ms. Erickson drew attention to the
  petition signed by neighbouring residents and the letters submitted in
  opposition to the proposed tower.
- Bevin Bilgalky, Sooke resident, spoke regarding Item 10.1. 5154 Sooke Road Freedom Mobile Telecommunications Tower. Mr. Bilgalky stated his opposition
  to the proposal due to health concerns and the existence of adequate cell
  phone coverage in the area.
- <u>Stephen Saunders</u>, Sooke resident, spoke regarding Item 10.1. 5154 Sooke
   Road Freedom Mobile Telecommunications Tower. Mr. Saunders reminded
   Council that a previous application for a telecommunications tower at this
   address was not supported by the neighbourhood, nor Council of the time. Mr.
   Saunders asserts that the only change has been the addition of fake foliage to
   change the appearance of the pole and that safety concerns and property
   devaluation are still factors.
- Peter Mouck, Sooke resident, spoke regarding Item 10.1. 5154 Sooke Road Freedom Mobile Telecommunications Tower. Mr. Mouck stated his opposition
  to the tower, and to other powerful telecommunications towers in Sooke due to
  health and safety concerns. Mr. Mouck further stated that declining property
  values and the loss of enjoyment of one's property should also be considered.
- Anna Saunders, Sooke resident, spoke regarding Item 10.1. 5154 Sooke Road

   Freedom Mobile Telecommunications Tower.
   Ms. Saunders expressed her opposition to the proposed tower due to health and safety concerns and stated that her health should not be negatively impacted for the sake of corporate

- profits. Ms. Saunders stated that she and her husband are impacted by the location of the tower which impedes their view. In response to a question from Council, Ms. Saunders clarified that the tower is to be located 208 meters from her deck.
- <u>Don Oberley</u>, owner of 5154 Sooke Road, spoke regarding Item 10.1. 5154
   Sooke Road Freedom Mobile Telecommunications Tower and expressed his support for the proposal. Mr. Oberley stated that he is confident that health and safety issues are not a concern, and that the tower will not be highly visible.
   Mr. Oberley spoke in support of improved cell phone service and increased consumer options for cell phone service.
- <u>Ellen Lewers</u>, Sooke resident, spoke regarding the proposed moratorium on cannabis retail stores and the effects of cannabis use in youth. Ms. Lewers encouraged regulation and licencing of cannabis sales operations.
- <u>Peter Mouck</u>, Sooke resident, spoke once more regarding Item 10.1. 5154 Sooke Road - Freedom Mobile Telecommunications Tower and the health effects of radiation exposure.
- <u>Stephen Saunders</u>, Sooke resident, spoke once more regarding Item 10.1. 5154 Sooke Road - Freedom Mobile Telecommunications Tower and restated that the proposed tower location is highly visible from his property.
- Erika Richard, representing Freedom Mobile, spoke regarding Item 10.1. 5154 Sooke Road Freedom Mobile Telecommunications Tower. Ms. Richard stated that the proposed location is the last link in a series of connecting infrastructure that will complete a new service network for Sooke. Ms. Richard pointed out that the effects of the proposed tower are 1% of the Health Canada standard, which the industry relies on for health and safety oversight. Additionally, Ms. Richard stated that efforts have been made to address the esthetics of the tower and minimize the impact on neighbours.
- <u>Margarita Dominquez</u>, Sooke resident, spoke regarding Item 12 Correspondence and stated that toxic illness in cats is very rare based on her experience with cat rescue in Sooke.
- Anna Saunders, Sooke resident, spoke once more regarding Item 10.1. 5154
   Sooke Road Freedom Mobile Telecommunications Tower station that cell
   phone coverage is very good in the neighbourhood of the proposed tower.
- <u>Tawny Verigen</u>, representing Freedom Mobile, spoke to the concerns raised by neighbouring property owners. Ms. Verigen restated that Freedom Mobile is bringing a new network with new consumer options to Sooke and is not attempting to augment existing cell phone coverage in the area of 5154 Sooke Road. Ms. Verigen also offered research that states property values are not affected by installation of telecommunications towers, and that health and safety concerns are well within the federal government's regulations. In response to a question from Council, Ms. Verigen stated that although cell phone providers can share infrastructure, there are no existing towers in the area in question.
- Steve Unger, Sooke resident, spoke regarding Item 10.1. 5154 Sooke Road Freedom Mobile Telecommunications Tower. As a former engineer in the cell
  phone industry, Mr. Unger informed Council that when a company speaks to
  their emissions in relation to Health Canada guidelines, they are referring to
  their output only. Mr. Unger encouraged Council to consider the aggregate
  effect of frequencies from multiple sources.







## 7. PUBLIC INPUT MEETINGS AND RELATED REPORTS

# 7.1. ALR Exclusion - 6912 West Coast Road

The Planner II provided a PowerPoint presentation and overview of the application for exclusion from the Agricultural Land Reserve at 6912 West Coast Road.

Council invited the applicant's representative to speak:

 <u>David Busch</u>, representing the applicant, addressed Council and spoke regarding the application. Mr. Busch provided an outline of the agricultural challenges faced by the land owner and the history of the property and requested Council support the application for exclusion from the Agricultural Land Reserve (ALR).

#### Council discussion:

- Previous proposal to use the subject property as a pig farm raised concern in the community.
- Rezoning of the property would take place should the property be removed from the ALR, including a public hearing.
- Sewer serviceability would need to be reviewed if future development was proposed.
- Contributing factors to drainage issues and means of improving soil.
- Requirements for "gate sales" to maintain agricultural status and suggested products that may thrive in existing conditions.

# **Public Input:**

- <u>Davis Burke</u>, 1900 Tominny Road, spoke against the application to remove the land from the ALR due to negative impacts on his quality of life and property value.
- Gerlinde Breumair, 1909 Tominny Road, spoke against the application to remove the land from the ALR stating her support for preservation of agricultural land and food production opportunities.
- <u>Ellen Lewers</u>, Sooke resident, spoke regarding the history of agricultural lands in Sooke and in support of protecting agricultural land, food production opportunities and the creation of a food and farm lands trust.
- <u>Eric Lindquist</u>, 6908 West Coast Road, stated that the subject land is capable
  of agricultural use and shared examples of his success in producing food on a
  neighbouring property. Mr. Lindquist stated he is of "mixed opinion" regarding
  the removal of the land from the ALR, but that he is opposed to the use of the
  land as a big farm due to negative impacts on quality of life and property
  values for nearby residents.
- <u>Patrick Gale</u>, Sooke resident, spoke against the application to remove the land from the ALR and provided suggestions of suitable agricultural uses for the subject property.
- <u>Steve Unger</u>, Sooke resident, spoke against the application to remove the land from the ALR stating that as a local farmer, he believes the land to be suitable for agricultural purposes.
- <u>Sinclair Philip</u>, Sooke resident, spoke against the application to remove the land from the ALR. Mr. Philip spoke regarding Sooke's history of agricultural, the importance of protecting remaining farmland, and the benefits of local food.

# 2019-2023 Five Year Financial Plan

Each department presented their budget requests to Council, then council discussion and public questions to follow each presentation.

The Interim Chief Administrative Officer advised Council that staff have diligently reviewed the budget, paring down items on wish lists and establishing only the essential items are brought forward to maximize District needs while minimizing the tax impact as much as possible.

# **Budget Overview**

The Acting Director of Finance provided an overview of the proposed 2019 budget with a review of the expenditures, revenues, funding sources, main budget changes, cost drivers and associated risks.

The following was highlighted:

- The 2019 total expenditures total is \$22,313,061, broken down through debt servicing, capital expenditures, transfer to reserves and additional municipal purposes.
- Breakdown of expenditures that will be funded by property taxes.
- Funding sources will be from property taxes, sewer taxes & fees, fees & charges, grants, borrowing, and transfer from reserves.
- Budget changes are most significantly impacted by 6 new staff positions, 5
  major reviews and planning projects, the new Provincial Employer Health Tax
  and an increase to the Roads Maintenance Contract.
  - o The Employer Health Tax alone is equal to a 1.6% property tax increase for 2019.
- A combination of significant population growth and historically low taxes has left the municipality playing catch up to ensure they are meeting the service levels and needs in the community.
- In the past reserves have been used to keep the tax rate low, but this is not sustainable for the future and something to review for future budget processes.
- With this proposed budget the property tax increase is set at 7.3% which is equal to an average of approximately \$87 per property.

# 5.2. Planning

The Head of Planning provided an overview of the proposed budget for the Planning department, highlighting the following:

- The department is revenue generating, and with an increase to fees such as pre-application meetings, there are future opportunities to increase revenue.
- Request to have a future plan reserve fund created to prepare for reviews and planning associated with master plans.
- Possible grant opportunity for summer student to assist in reviewing the zoning bylaw, master planning projects and research.

#### **Council Discussion:**

 Desire to review and implement application fees associated with preapplication meetings.

# 5.3. Development Services

The Director of Development Services provided an overview of the sections encompassed within the department providing information for each, as highlighted below:

# **Engineering & Subdivision**

- Road Improvement program will continue as previously approved.
- A new Municipal Engineer position has been identified as an immediate need and is included in the budget.

#### **Council Discussion:**

- There was a discrepancy in the 2019 Capital Plan for Engineering-Five Year Road Program, change from \$800,000 to \$700,000 (clerical error).
- Desire to see an advanced infrastructure plan for the future of our roads and sidewalks.
- Decrease the dependence on reserves and more concentration on saving for projects.
- Confirmation that the line painting is progressing and that we are partnering with neighboring municipalities on specialty line painting projects to decrease cost.
- Improved sidewalks and cross walks for the community.

- DeMamiel Creek/Little River Connector project will be completed in two phases which will see a multi-use trail and creek crossing for approximately \$30,000.
   There will be grants to support this project.
- John Phillips Memorial Park and Whiffin Spit parking lot will both see new washroom and multi function fountains installed in 2019 for a total cost of \$105,000.
- The Cains Park staircase, which is a carry over from 2018, is expected to cost \$55,000.
- A new Whiffin Spit memorial wall will be funded by the Sooke Program of the Arts reserve fund but will be executed by the parks department. This stand alone structure has the capacity for up to 250 brass plaques and is an alternative to the bench donation program.
- The Bluffs Park staircase project, which was built in the 1990's is deteriorating and requires a full replacement, with a \$150,000 project estimate.

Councillor Logins arrived to the meeting at 5:20 p.m.

### **Council Discussion:**

- Concerns with the cost of the water fountains and potential vandalism.
- Cost recovery options for projects in public spaces, possibly expand memorial dedication options to staircases and or plaques in other parks.

The Fire Chief provided an overview of the Community Safety department.

# 5.1. **Emergency Program**

The Assistant Fire Chief provided an overview of the proposed budget for the Sooke Emergency Program, highlighting the following:

- Successes in grant applications over the past year.
- There will be an increase due to the new Capital Regional District Public Alert Notification System (CRD PANS), which the District is included to access information in major emergency situations.
- Retirement of the Emergency Support Services (ESS) Director.
- The ESS coordinator role has transferred to the Assistant Fire Chief.

### **Council Discussion:**

- Updates requested on grants applied for and received.
- Media release requested once the CRD PANS ENS system is active.

### 5.2. **Bylaw**

The Fire Chief provided an overview of the proposed budget for the Bylaw department, highlighting the following:

- An additional bylaw enforcement officer was hired part way through 2018, salaries and professional development have been adjusted to include the new hire.
- There is a need for an additional vehicle for this department and an opportunity to re-purpose municipally owned vehicles from the Fire Department.

### **Council Discussion:**

 Clarification that a portion of the Fire Chief's salary is accounted for in bylaw salaries, as he is the supervisor of this section.

# 5.3. **Building**

The Fire Chief provided an overview of the propose budget for the Building section, highlighting the following:

- Salaries include 2 additional positions; Chief Building Official and a File/Plan Checker position.
- There is a need for an additional vehicle for the building department, an option could be to re-purpose an already municipally owned vehicle from the Fire Department.
- The professional development budget will need to be re-examined for 2021, once the new positions are filled.

#### **Council Discussion:**

 Request that once the building process changes are implemented the District host an education session for local builders.

# 5.4. **Fire**

The Fire Chief provided an overview of the proposed budget for the Fire department, highlighting the following:

- A future large capital apparatus replacement plan has been implemented, with 2019 being the most substantial year of the next 5 years.
- Reallocation of funds for the purchase of Battalion 1.
- The need to replace or re-purpose Squad 2 (van).
- Pre-approved replacement of Engine 3 will see the District borrow \$400,000 for the chassis in 2019 and \$400,00 in 2020.
- The funds in the Hose Tower Improvement fund will be reallocated to enhance training needs and firefighter development, by creating a safer compound, enhanced garage repair area and gym improvements.
- Upgrades to security will include video surveillance at Station 1 and key fob replacement.
- New firefighter position created as Assistant Fire Chief position has been removed from the union.
- Request for an additional firefighter could be cost neutral, as there would be less paid out vacation and overtime.

- The property maintenance costs are significantly as the municipal building is old and requires frequent repairs, as well as new office spaces accommodate for additional staff.

The Head of Planning clarified that there is a covenant on title that Mr. Mitchell can apply to amend to address the Affordable Housing policy requirement in some other form, such as through provision of land or cash in lieu, if he did not wish to enter into an Affordable Housing Agreement. The section 219 covenant states that the owner shall enter into an Affordable Housing Agreement and designate and construct 10% of the dwelling units on the Land as Affordable Housing Units and that the initial sale price of each unit would be restricted to a maximum of \$220,000.

- Clarification that there is a covenant on title and only Council has the authority to remove said covenant.
- Concerns regarding the contribution amount in comparison to number of units.
  - The Head of Planning clarified that the total number of units was 18 units, not 6 as stated by the presenter, which is equivalent to \$220,000 or \$12,200 per unit.

Council recommended Mr. Mitchell work with staff to find an amicable solution to amending the current covenant.

The Planner I presented an overview of the proposed amendment to the Sooke Zoning Bylaw to add "Cannabis Retails Stores" as a permitted use in the General Commercial (C2) and Recreation (C4) zones, which is restricted to four properties in the District.

Mayor Tait read a written statement advising that any person who believes their interest in property affected by the proposed bylaw would be given a reasonable opportunity to be heard and have their written submission presented at the Public Hearing.

Mayor Tait called the Public Hearing to order at 7:20 p.m.

#### **Public Submissions:**

- <u>David Bloom</u>, 1991 Kaltasin Road, expressed his concerns regarding ventilation and residual odors affecting neighboring businesses.
- <u>Dave Bertoia</u>, 5448 Sooke Road, raised his concerns with the property at 5449 Sooke Road, noting the area as a high accident zone along with poor logistics for entry and exit at this location. Mr. Bertoia enjoys the current businesses and hopes they will remain.
- <u>Larry Galbraith</u>, 5462 Sooke Road, spoke in opposition of including the property at 5449 Sooke Road due to the high accident zone at the location entrance.
- Michelle Savory, 2038 Townsend Road, spoke in opposition of cannabis retail
  and inquired about the lift of the moratorium on Cannabis stores in the
  community.
  - Mayor Tait stated that Council was unaware at the time of implementation that they were outside of their authority in implementing that moratorium which has led to the current public hearing for rezoning to allow for retail cannabis stores on certain commercial properties of the community.
- Brenda Jorgensen, 2322 Galena Road, spoke in support of 6309, 6686 and 6691 Sooke Road as they are currently servicing the community with a product in a slow growth industry. Ms. Jorgensen suggested progressive ventures in tourism and Cannabis consumption spaces could benefit the community.
- Scot Taylor, owner of 5449 Sooke Road, stated that the restaurant and recreational components will remain open and that cannabis retail will be an addition to current operations. Mr. Taylor noted that his accredited college would provide an economic advantage providing programs, education and teaching opportunities, providing a different avenue for retail cannabis.
- Gail Hall, 2517 Sooke River Road, expressed her opposition to cannabis retail.

The Public Hearing was closed at 7:48 p.m.

#### **Council Discussion:**

- Confirmation that federally approved licenses will allow for sales and that the Province conduct site visits.
- The traffic concerns are addressed at each business location by the Ministry of Transportation.
- Any additions or new construction would result in a referral back to Council in the form of a Development Permit.
- There is an opportunity for the District to be an industry leader in cannabis.

- Traffic concerns at 5449 Sooke Road are not isolated to the business, it is the area itsself.
- Take advantage of the demand for professionals in the industry to support jobs and local business.

- Don Thome, the representative of the applicant, confirmed that the current owner has owned the property since 1976 and it has been a rental unit the entire time.

#### **Council Discussion:**

- Councillor Bateman was opposed to the rezoning, expressing his concerns
  with growth in the area which appears to not be prepared for expansion. He
  suggested waiting until the Official Community Plan (OCP) review is completed

- Clarity was provided regarding enforcement of bylaws and policies, noting that Council does not have the authority to instruct building officials or any staff to take action; the Council implements the bylaws and staff enforce them.
- This is an emotionally charged issue affecting all parties involved.
- Concerns with the disrespectful and derogatory emails, social media posts and comments from the public to elected officials and staff; these have been unnecessary and contain inaccurate information.
- Support from the District for the hatchery, their exemplary efforts to increase salmon stocks and provide education on issues facing the coast.

# 7. PUBLIC HEARINGS AND RELATED BYLAWS

# 7.1. Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 733 (600-70), 2019 - 6690 Rhodonite Drive

The Planner I provided a PowerPoint presentation and overview of the proposed amendment at 6690 Rhodonite Drive to rezone the property from Large Lot Residential (R1) to Medium Lot Residential (R2) for the creation of a four-lot subdivision. Highlights included providing a \$30,000 affordable housing contribution along with cash-in-lieu for Park Dedication and for 2-meter wide sidewalk.

Mayor Tait invited the applicant to address Council, they declined as they had no future additions to the staff presentation.

### **Council Discussion:**

• Concerns with traffic impacts and desire for further analysis on duplexes versus single-family dwellings.

Mayor Tait read a written statement advising that any person who believes their interest in the property affected by the proposed bylaw would be given a reasonable opportunity to be heard and have their written submission presented at the Public Hearing.

Mayor Tait called the Public Hearing to order at 7:18 p.m.

### **Public Submissions:**

- Ron Dumont, Sooke resident, expressed concern with the hammerhead driveway and lack of additional fire hydrants.
  - The Planner I advised Council on the internal referral process and that no significant issues were raised that would impede the rezoning and further review would occur at the time of subdivision.
  - Mayor Tait read out the internal referral from the Fire Department included in the staff report.
- <u>Jay Ryan</u>, Sooke resident, spoke regarding the sale of the land and legal issues between the applicant and the strata who previously owned the property. Mr. Ryan also stated that he was unaware that the property would be rezoned and claimed the buyer was dealing in bad faith.
  - Mayor Tait advised that the merits of comments should be directly related to the land rezoning and not include civil issues between parties as they are not related to the application before Council.
- <u>Stan Planeta</u>, Sooke resident, expressed his opposition with concerns of reduced privacy, an excessive number of houses on the lot and potential lossof future property value.
- <u>Brian Davis</u>, Sooke resident, conveyed his concerns regarding increased onstreet parking, lack of sidewalks in this area to support foot traffic and noted that higher density is being planned with minimal infrastructure to support an increase. Mr. Davis questioned the measurement process for notifications.
  - Mayor Tait clarified that cash-in-lieu for sidewalks wouldn't add a portion of a sidewalk in front of the property; rather funds will be taken and saved for future sidewalk construction
- <u>Barb McKay</u>, Sooke resident, expressed her concerns with changes to the
  aesthetic and appeal of the neighborhood, suggesting the addition of height
  restrictions and highlighted the impact of on-street parking. Ms. McKay
  provided photos of the neighbouring homes for reference.
- <u>John Mills</u>, Sooke resident, addressed Council with concerns regarding onstreet parking and noted that increased cars equal increased parking issues.
   Mr. Mills expressed his dissatisfication with the limited information included in the notice and concerns with the notification signage placed on the property.
- Graham Marshall, Sooke resident, spoke regarding concerns with massproduced houses on one lot which will be distinctly different than the homes already in the neighborhood.

- <u>Ellen Lewers</u>, Sooke resident, spoke in regard to sidewalk concerns and proposed infill ruining the vision of this particular area of the community. Ms. Lewers inquired about the notification distance for the application.
  - Staff informed Council that the requirement for notification is all properties within a 100m radius of the subject property which received letters via mail. A public notice was placed in the local newspaper for 2 consecutive weeks and public noticed placed on District Notice boards and on the website.
- Roy Banner, Colwood resident and representative for the applicant, spoke to the strata concerns stating that the subdivision application was communicated at the time of purchase.
- Suzie Davis, Sooke resident, expressed concerns with increased traffic and limited parking.

The Public Hearing was closed at 7:58 p.m.

### Council Discussion

- Councillor Beddows was opposed to the rezoning due to the Fire Department comments and concerns with the number of units proposed.
- The difficulties in driving on Rhodonite due to street parking and concerns with increased traffic to the area.
- Reiteration that staff are professionals and meticulously review applications and that Council needs to trust their expertise.
- A concern with residents feeling there was a lack of effective communication.
- Councillor Bateman was opposed to the rezoning due to major traffic increase and lack of maintaining form and character of the neighborhood.
- Councillor Logins was opposed to the rezoning due to the area being an active foot traffic route, lack of adequate sidewalks and limited parking proposed for the units.
- Mayor Tait was opposed to the rezoning, expressing past negative experiences in this area and a desire to see less densification.

# 7.2. Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 736 (600-71), 2019 - 1939 Maple Ave South

The Planner I provided a PowerPoint presentation and an overview of the proposed amendment to rezone the property located at 1939 Maple Avenue South from Large Lot Residential (R1) to Medium Lot Residential (R2) for the creation of three (3) new single-family dwelling lots, for a total of four (4) lots. It was advised that this property would be exempt from the development permit process due to the scale of subdivision, the applicant will provide \$5,000 per lot an an affordable housing contribution, along with cash-in-lieu for future sidewalk and parkland dedications.

Mayor Tait invited the application to address Council.

Gerrard LeBlanc, the applicant's representative, advised Council of the history of the property, highlighting the driveway access off the back end of the property will reduce traffic onto Maple Avenue and that the request provides 1 additional lot above the current zone allowance. Mr. LeBlanc expressed concerns with the requested amount towards the affordable housing contributions and noted that the applicant felt pressured into the contribution and requested Council reduce the contribution by half the amount of what planning proposed.

- The affordable housing contribution creates a fund for the creation of future affordable housing.
- Need for a bylaw to limit negotiation and ensure parameters associated with contributions clearly defined.
- Lack of support to reduce the contribution.

CREST is looking to expand its infrastructure to provide improved coverage to the Sooke and Juan de Fuca area. New technology is being phased in throughout the system, with the Westshore slated for inclusion in the coming months.

   Clarification that redundancy is built into the system to ensure adequate coverage if the Mount McGuire infrastructure fails.
- Cell phone providers to be encouraged to work closely with CREST to share tower infrastructure where possible.

# 7.2. Physicians for Global Survival

Dr. Jonathan Down, representing the Physicians for Global Survival presented a PowerPoint and overview of an international campaign to abolish nuclear weapons. Dr. Down provided Council with background information on why municipalities are being approached and requested Council send a letter calling for the federal government to sign the Treaty on Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons.

- "Nuclear Clock" set at two minutes to midnight, which indicates a more urgent situation than during the Cuban Missile Crisis.
- Jurisdiction for disarmament and prohibition of nuclear weapons is a federal responsibility. Local government is in advocacy position only.

Jeff Weightman, Project Manager for the proposed Capital Regional District (CRD) Foodlands Access Program, provided an overview of the project history to date. The CRD adopted an Agricultural Strategy in 2016, subsequently prioritized access to land as the primary consideration, and engaged a consultant to look at land access practices across North America. The consultant's report recommended a land trust be established and the process of community engagement to determine regional interest is now underway.

- Intention of program is to provide opportunities for new farmers. Mr.
   Weightman stated that a mix of new and established farmers may be considered to facilitate knowledge transfer.

- Clarification that intention is not to include housing on subject land.
- Suggestion that suitable park land might be considered for agricultural purposes. Council to suggest that CRD look at this option.
- Program Advisory Committee may be required as decision-making body.

Council heard from the following members of the public:

• <u>Ellen Lewers</u>, spoke regarding Item 6.1.*CRD Foodlands Access Program*, stating that she believes the program offers an unfair advantage to new farmers at the expense of established farms. Ms. Lewers would like to see regulations regarding residential vs. farm water rates changed, as well as other legislation that negatively impacts small farms.

- Marria Gauley, representing her son Patrick Gauley-Gale, spoke regarding Item 6.1. CRD Foodlands Access Program. Ms. Gauley encouraged Council to support the Foodlands Access Program and to incorporate food security into plans for developments and subdivisions. Ms. Gauley added that agricultural activities are a means of honouring our land and traditions, as well as preparing for emergencies and subsequent food shortages.
- <u>Ellen Lewers</u>, spoke for a second time regarding Item 6.1. *CRD Foodlands Access Program*. Ms. Lewers shared a recent experience with wildlife conservation officers that she believed to be punitive to farmers and spoke in support of increasing the number of community gardens.
- Mary Alice Johnson, spoke regarding Item 6.1. CRD Foodlands Access
   Program and encouraged Council to participate in regional action to address
   issues of food security and the rising costs of land that makes farming and
   food production an unattainable goal for many.

The Manager of Planning provided a PowerPoint presentation and overview of the application to rezone 2020 Kaltasin Road from Rural Residential (RU4) to Community Facilities (P2), with the intent of converting the existing single-family dwelling to a Community Care (daycare) facility for 16 children.

#### Council discussion:

- Clarification regarding types of permeable surfaces that are permitted for parking areas.
- "Licensing" refers to Island Health childcare licenses required to operate a childcare facility.

#### **Public Submissions:**

- <u>Ellen Lewers</u>, Sooke resident, inquired as to why a traffic impact assessment
  was required, why paving the parking lot was recommended, why a residence
  and a daycare cannot be located on the same lot, and why additional sidewalk
  contributions were required. Ms. Lewers stated her support for the proposed
  daycare but cautioned that unnecessary requirements may dissuade business
  development.
- <u>Jay Ryan</u> suggested that paving requirements for parking lots should apply to all businesses equally as a requirement of rezoning.
- Staff provided clarification that rezoning requirements apply equally to all applications, in accordance with all municipal plans and policies.

Mayor Tait called a second and third time for submissions to the Public Hearing for *Zoning Amendment Bylaw* No. 747 (600-75), 2019.

The Corporate Officer further noted that two pieces of public correspondence had been received, one of which was provided in a Supplemental Agenda, and the second of which was provided on table.

The Manager of Planning provided a PowerPoint presentation and overview of the application to rezone 5490 Sooke Road from Rural (RU2) to Neighbourhood Commercial (C1) to allow veterinary clinic as a Primary Use, as well as amending the land use designation in the *Official Community Plan* from Agriculture to Gateway Residential.

#### **Public Submissions:**

- Kerrie Reay spoke in support of the proposed bylaw amendments and stated
  that the applicant is an exemplary corporate citizen, listing examples of Dr.
  Booth's community involvement and proactive business practices. Ms. Reay
  further stated that she believes the applicant should not be required to pay
  fees associated with her rezoning application, as the District changed her
  zoning without her knowledge in 2006.
- <u>Ellen Lewers</u> encouraged Council to waive fees associated with rezoning 5490 Sooke Road, as the applicant's zoning was changed by the District without her knowledge.
- <u>Gail Nash</u> spoke in support of the Sooke Veterinary Clinic and noted that as a long-time resident of the neighbourhood, she has always found the business to be respectful and rule-abiding. Ms. Nash echoed previous speaker's comments that the applicant should not have to pay for what she believes is a bureaucratic mistake.
- <u>Derek Lewers</u> inquired as to the zoning history of the subject property and how a land owner can have their zoning changed without their knowledge. Mr. Lewers stated that he does not believe the applicant should have to pay the

- rezoning fees and further inquired as to the notification process that would have been followed at the time the zoning was changed in 2006.
- Staff clarified that the change in 2006 was that "veterinary clinic" was no longer listed as a permissible use in the existing zone. Staff stated that had rezoning occurred, the legislation at that time would have been followed including notification requirements.
- <u>Ellen Lewers</u> further inquired as to the notification process that was followed in 2006. Mayor Tait stated that information was not currently available.

<u>Jay Ryan</u>, owner of Buffy's Pub and Liquor Store, addressed Council and spoke regarding:

- Shuttle service available on Friday and Saturday nights reduces the number of vehicles requiring parking.
- Complaints from neighbouring property regarding dust, yet neighbour generates equal dust and noise.
- Desire to leave the area to the rear of the pub unpaved.

#### Council discussion:

- Application is to increase square footage by adding a patio area without increasing the permitted occupancy.
- Clarification regarding proposed patio operations. Mr. Ryan confirmed the patio area will close at 10:00 p.m., will not have its own sound system, and will have a video camera installed.
- Regulations regarding smoking and vaping will apply to patio area.

#### **Public Input:**

- <u>Ellen Lewers</u> spoke regarding the potential for noise transfer to neighbouring properties and suggested the patio be moved to the front of the property, with parking added to the rear.
- <u>Les Haddad</u>, Sooke resident, stated that noise levels can be a concern in the late evening and sought clarification that the patio would be closed at 10:00 p.m.
- <u>Bob Wormsley</u>, spoke in support of the application, stating that the establishment is well-run, and that parking is sufficient.
- Shauna Holm, adjacent property owner, stated that she provided written correspondence outlining her concerns regarding dust, noise and parking. Ms. Holm encouraged Council to require an 8-foot boarded fence as a condition of the variance, in order to better protect her property from the proposed patio.

#### Council discussion:

- Noise seems to have been considered and an increase is not anticipated as the patio will close at 10:00 p.m.
- No community concerns noted by liquor licensing, nor noise complaints since 2012.
- Most objections are related to the rear parking lot, but it is not part of the application.

THAT COUNCIL consider the building at 2076 Otter Point Rd, is in a hazardous condition, within the meaning of Section 73(2)(b) of the *Charter*, as a result of contraventions of the BC Fire Code, the District of Sooke's Bylaw No. 296, Unsightly Premises and Objectionable Situations Bylaw, 2007, and the District of Sooke's Policy 9.4, Unsightly Premises and Other Objectionable Situations Policy, 2007.

THAT COUNCIL considers that the Building is in and creates an unsafe condition, within the meaning of Section 73(2)(a) of the *Charter*, as a result of the Building being unoccupied for several years, it has deteriorated, and being easily accessible and the Building contravening the British Columbia Building Code, the British Columbia Plumbing Code, and the British Columbia Fire Code.

THAT COUNCIL declare that the Building is a nuisance, within the meaning of Section 74(2) of the *Charter*, as Council considers the Building to be so dilapidated and unclean as to be offensive and pose a risk to the community.

THAT COUNCIL hereby requires pursuant to its remedial action powers under Part 3, Division 12 of the *Charter* that the Owner undertake the following:

- demolish and remove the Building, including the foundation, no later than thirty (30) days after notice of this remedial action requirement under s. 77 of the Charter has been sent by the District to the Owner;
- erect a strongly constructed fence of a maximum height of 2.5 meters tall
  around the area where the Building was formerly located until the hole created
  by the removal of the Building, and foundation, is filled in and levelled no later
  than thirty (30) days after notice of this remedial action requirement under s. 77
  of the Charter has been sent by the District to the Owner; and
- Ensure Protection of the Public in relation to any hole created by the removal
  of the Building, as per the BC Building Code S. 8.1.2.2, no later than thirty (30)
  days after notice of this remedial action requirement under s. 77 of the Charter
  has been sent by the District to the Owner

# 4. PUBLIC AND STATUTORY HEARINGS

Mayor Tait read a statement advising that any person who believes their interest in the properties affected by the proposed bylaws, and temporary use permit, would be given a reasonable opportunity to be heard and have their written submissions presented at the Public Hearing.

Mayor Tait called the Public Hearing to order at 7:05 p.m.

# 4.1. PH 1 - Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 738 (600-72), 2019 - 2365 Church Road

The Manager of Planning provided a PowerPoint presentation and overview of the written staff report to amend the zoning at 2365 Church Road from Large Lot Residential (R1) to Community Facilities (P2), for the purpose of converting the existing dwelling to a Community Care Facility (daycare). It was highlighted that side lot setbacks, landscaping requirements and parking would be assessed at the building and development (variance) permit stage, not at rezoning.

# **Council Discussion:**

- Confirmation that the property is connected to sewer.
- Clarity that the Vancouver Island Health Authority (VIHA) approves the number of children and provide the licensing.
- Concerns with limited parking for both drop off/ pick up and staff, as well as the increase to traffic in the residential neighborhood.
- Desire to include secure bike area for parents and/ or staff.

Mayor Tait invited the applicant to address Council.

Mari Mdk, manager of the proposed daycare, advised Council that they are waiting on the completing of the rezoning to submit their request to VIHA; the desired number of kids is 12 spaces on the upper floor (infant toddler) and 16-18 spaces on the lower (3-5 year old) and 3-6 employees. However, this is contingent on the assessment and recommendations of VIHA. She suggested hours of operation would be 6:00 am - 5:00 pm but is unable to confirm definitively.

#### **Public Submissions:**

- <u>Craig Ferguson</u>, Sooke resident, expressed concerns with noise from daycare, as a neighboring property, as his spouse is a shift worker and sleeps during the day.
- <u>lan Roberts</u>, Sooke resident, expressed concerns with increased vehicle traffic on a quite street, as those leaving or picking up their children may be in a rush, the blind corner offers limited visibility and general concern with a change in the dynamics of the neighborhood.

- <u>Karen Jack</u>, Sooke resident, requested assurances that street parking would be utilized only for residents in the neighborhood and not for the daycare.
  - The Manager of Planning stated that street parking is for anyone, as public right-of-way, and that she is not aware of any roads that are specifically designated for residents only.

#### **Council Discussion:**

- Childcare spaces are limited, and another facility is needed to support community growth.
- Although not a requirement, it would be nice of the applicant to mitigate sound by installing a buffer.
- Confidence that any traffic and parking impacts will be mitigated through the building and development permitting stages.

# 4.2. PH 2 - Official Community Plan Amendment Bylaw No. 742 (400-13), 2019 & Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 741 (600-73), 2019 - Cannabis

The Corporate Officer reminded Council of the supplementary information provided for this Public Hearing.

The Manager of Planning provided a PowerPoint presentation and overview of the written staff report to amend the *Official Community Plan Bylaw* to permit the issuance of Temporary Use Permits for "Cannabis Production-Micro" outside the Town Centre in Rural and Commercial zones. Also, to update Section 6.0 Part IV Temporary Use Permits to accommodate for the changes and general housekeeping amendments. Followed by an amendment to the *Sooke Zoning Bylaw* to add two new definitions: "Cannabis Production-Micro" and "Cannabis Production-Standard" excluding these uses from the general definition of "Agriculture".

# **Council Discussion:**

- Concerns that the Temporary Use Permit option will be limiting and too rigorous to attract industry professionals.
- Concerns with lack of municipalities engaging in similar changes, to compare and track impacts.
- Federal regulations are expected to change as the system become less inundated with applications, and research is completed.
- Agricultural Land Reserves (ALR) regulations are specific and the district can not supersede the Agricultural Land Commission (ALC).

- Confirmation that the District does not require a building permit for farm structures, that is within the purview of the ALC.
- Differences between Temporary Use Permit and rezoning to industrial, along with associated limitations.
- Desire to create opportunities for a new and growing sector of industry and to be a leader in the region.
- Confirmation that facilities will not be a store front, there will be no drop-in or public access. The facilities will be private and fully secure.
- Development Permits will trigger a form and charter review and the most appropriate design in the area will be requested.

#### **Public Submissions:**

- <u>Ellen Lewers</u>, Sooke resident, expressed concern with building being constructed on ALR lands.
- <u>Scot Taylor</u>, Sooke resident, noted the risk factor of limiting industry investment with the Temporary Use Permit. Mr. Taylor suggested a future connection with tourism to smaller micro growers, with the option of production and retail connections much like a brewery or winery.

#### **Council Discussion:**

- Concerns that there is not enough support from commercial industry and lack of benefit to investor market.
- Amendments can be made later, should there be support for changes. This option allows for a starting point.

# 4.3. PH 3 - Temporary Use Permit for 5536 Sooke Road

The Corporate Officer reminded Council that one (1) piece of additional correspondence was received from the CRD related to Item No. 4.3. in their Supplementary Agenda packages.

The Manager of Planning provided a PowerPoint presentation and overview of the written staff report for the application of a Temporary Use Permit, for a maximum 3 years, for the property located at 5536 Sooke Road for the following historic non-conforming uses: Vehicle and Equipment Repairs, Machine Shop, Auto-body Paint Shop, Accessory Storage Yard, Accessory Retail Sales, as well as a new Temporary Use of Vehicle Sales. The following was highlighted:

- The property is zoned Small Scale Agriculture (RU3) which does not permit commercial or industrial uses; therefore, the application must request a Temporary Use Permit to accommodate for the existing uses.
- Insufficient information and lack of communication on behalf of the applicant has led to staff's recommendation of refusal.
  - A request for a rainwater management plan was made with a one (1) month timeline for the applicant to submit, the plan has not been submitted and no response received from contact attempts made by staff on July 8, August 19, August 23 and September 16, 2019.
  - The late requirement for the rainwater management plan was due to the amended referral reviewing the amount and proximity of onsite paving in relation to the creek.

 The report includes alternative options for consideration, strongly recommending any alternative should include conditions and associated timelines.

The Manager of Planning provided an overview of the Temporary Use Permit process and interactions, to date, with the applicant. Also, advising of a point of procedure that Council should waive Policy 9.1. prior to a decision on the application.

#### **Council Discussion:**

- Confirmation that there is outstanding landscaping rehabilitation to the riparian area requires the applicant to enter into an agreement with the District, with associated bonding.
- Confirmation that vehicle sales are not an existing use on the property nor included under the historical non-conforming uses.
- The following remain incomplete: rainwater management plan, landscaping plan, height verification of onsite buildings.
- Clarity that the supplementary correspondence from Capital Regional District Parks was in conjunction with notifications sent to adjacent landowners, as the Galloping Goose Trail borders the property.
- Reiteration that the applicant is responsible to ensure activities are not in contravention of the *Fisheries Act*, via external agency referral comments, and the applicant is to contact the Department of Fisheries and Oceans to request a submission of a Request for Review.
- Clarity that if Council chose to endorse the staff recommendation, the applicant would be unable to obtain a business license and would continue a nonconforming use. A request would be made of Council to provide direction on enforcement.

# Members of the public:

- <u>Ellen Lewers</u>, Sooke resident, spoke in opposition of issuing a Temporary Use Permit and expressed concerns with the additional requested uses not being historic.
- <u>Derek Lewers</u>, Sooke resident, spoke in opposition of issuing a Temporary Use Permit, providing a PowerPoint presentation highlighting his concerns, including; fire compliance with the main building, concerns with lack of external referral comments, lack of consideration in setbacks from adjourning properties and the creek, changes with BC assessment from farm to light industrial (business & other), ongoing bylaw infractions, and lack of permits for buildings on the property. Mr. Lewers also expressed dissatisfaction with the tax contributions of the property owner, who operates a business and is not paying industrial taxes. In his final comment, Mr. Lewers requested Council consider the following, should they approve the Temporary Use Permit: an engineered sound wall between neighboring properties, evergreen trees along property line, limited hours of operation between 8:00 am-5:00 pm, Monday Saturday, require external overhead lighting to be turned off at 9:00 pm, that no new construction or uses be permitted and that no commercial access be permitted on the shared driveway easement.

\*\*\*\*\*\*\*

The video stream experienced a failure, stopped streaming and the remainder of the meeting was not recorded.

\*\*\*\*\*\*\*

- <u>Diane Bernard</u>, Sooke resident, spoke in support of the recommendation presented by staff, urging the correction of past mistakes. Ms. Bernard stressed the importance of salmon habitat preservation and agricultural land integrity.
- <u>Gail Nash</u>, Sooke resident, spoke in support of the recommendation presented by staff as this business has been allowed to operate in non-compliance long enough.
- Amanda Booth, Sooke resident and business owner, spoke in support of the recommendation presented by staff stating anything other than refusal will reinforce the bad behavior of the business owner.
- <u>Melissa Curtis</u>. Sooke resident, inquired into whether bylaw infractions on the property have been addressed.
  - The Bylaw Officer advised that bylaw has not revisited the site for compliance, however the requirement for compliance could be a requirement prior to issuance of the Temporary Use Permit.
- <u>Donna Gray</u>, Sooke resident and co-owner of the property spoke in support of the application and stated there were no complaints on record with the District prior to 2017. She provided an overview and timeline of past and present interactions with the District. She expressed a desire to comply while identifying the setbacks suffered due to the financial burdens of the required work.
- <u>lan Lacker</u>, employee of the applicant, identified that the applicant provides a business that is not available anywhere else in the community and that the operation was his lively hood.
- <u>Justin McCormick</u>, Sooke resident and contractor for applicant, informed that he had been recently been contracted to complete the storm water management and riparian rehabilitation plan, but was unable to provide a timeline for the completion of required reports.
- <u>Gail Hall</u>, Sooke resident, spoke in support of the staff recommendation and reminded Council of their responsibility in making a decision that is best for the community and aligns with District bylaws. Ms. Hall stated that these issues have been ongoing for many years and various Councils, a decision needs to be made.
- <u>Troy Lovvbakke</u>, Sooke resident, reminded Council that since the start of operation the District has supported this business over the years by utilizing

their services. Mr. Lovvbakke suggested Council provide additional time to the applicant to complete the requirements asked, as they are heavy requests.

- Shawn Driver, applicant, provided a history of the business license process undertaken with the District, expressed that the goal posts keep moving and the difficulty in achieving compliance with all the requests. Mr. Driver stated that he has continued to work towards all requests, and provided the following statements:
  - A letter was sent to him requiring a cease and desist on the removal of dangerous tree(s) on his property.
  - BC Assessment has been to the property, they are satisfied with the evaluation.
  - o Welding shops are considered Commercial, not Industrial.
  - o The Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure (MOTI) removed the trees along the frontage and have returned to the property to reevaluate the ditch and catch basin as they were improperly installed.
  - o Concerns that the Riparian report previously submitted by a certified professional is being considered insufficient, and now staff wants an engineering stamp.
  - Requested Council read the universal human right code article 23 and
  - o Advised that his business pays taxes, donates to local charities, works in the community, and employees' members of the community.
  - o Concern that this process has brought on negativity directed toward him.
- <u>Julie Ann Rayburn</u>, Sooke resident, spoke generally to the wonderful diversity of the sasseenos area.

Mayor Tait stated that the District of Sooke needs to turn the page to ensure business and property owners in the community are in compliance to municipal bylaws.

- Applicant has disregarded the request to comply, displayed a lack of desire to communicate or provide the necessary documentation to proceed towards the issuance of a Temporary Use Permit.
- Reiteration that non-compliance in the District, regardless of the business or property or owner, can not continue.
- The Official Community Plan (OCP) review will assess this area and possibly see the sassenos area included with commercial zoning options. The OCP dictates area zoning and overrides any Council desire, as a community vision document.
- Fair and proper governance is top priority.
- Councillor McMath was opposed to a refusal and requested the applicant be provided additional time to submit the required documents and reports, as this business is important to the community.
- Councils have not stood up in the past to make the decision, leaving this Council to deal the difficult situation of enforcing compliance.
- The knowledge that the business is non-conforming means the situation needs to be addressed and not left unresolved.
- Councillor St-Pierre was opposed to a refusal and suggested additional time be provided to comply.

Mayor Tait clarified that should this resolution of refusal pass, then this is the last resort for the applicant to comply.

The Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) advised Council that at a meeting held on August 7, 2019, the applicant provided surety to the Mayor and CAO that the storm water/ rainwater management plans would be provided. Additional emails were sent to follow up, however this communication outreach was left unanswered.





# 5.1. <u>2019 Service Level Review</u>

The Chief Administrative Officer provided an overview of the service level review and the 2019 budget cycle process, requesting Council consider the financial impact that changes to services provided by the District would have on the 2020 budget.

Each department provided a high-level overview of daily tasks and objectives, along with operational and/or capital projects undertaken or planned in the 2019 budget.

# **MUNICIPAL COUNCIL**

Resources are allocated to ensure Council is able to perform its governance and leadership role. This budget also allows for Council to administer grants to community organizations, training opportunities, event sponsorship, and community initiatives.

# **Council Discussion:**

- Enhanced funding for community events.
  - Staff advised that an increase to events would require additional funding to Corporate Services if the District organizes the events.
- Increased community grant funding and a review of the application process.
- Review of Council Contingency; pros and cons to increasing.
- Confirmation that the travel budget will remain unchanged.

# OFFICE OF THE CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER

This department assists Council with long-term planning, providing leadership to staff, builds relationships with external agencies and oversees the municipality in its entirety.

# **Council Discussion:**

- Budget to remain unchanged with a revaluation next year.
- Clarity that the forecasted budget for 2019 will be lower than anticipated due to the organizational review being completed in house.

# **CORPORATE SERVICES**

This department fulfills statutory requirements, compiles and publishes agendas, records minutes and provides subsequent follow up, attends and supports all Council and Committees meetings, handles public hearings, advertising, bylaws/ policy management, coordinates the annual report, manages communication functions for the District, handles Freedom of Information (FOI) requests, special events, records management, manages municipal agreements and undertakes municipal elections.

#### **Council Discussion:**

- Request for costing on yearly FOI requests.
- Inquiry on the review process of bylaws & policies.
  - Staff advised that a list is under reviewed as many are no longer relevant or legislation has superseded the bylaw/policy.
- Options for contracting out event planning.
  - Staff advised that District hosted events would likely still require a staff liaison.
- Confirmation that the subscriptions and memberships are well-utilized, such as iCompass and Quickscribe which provides access to legislation.

#### **PLANNING**

This department provides advice and recommendations to Council on planning related matters, such as Zoning and Official Community Plan (OCP) amendments, development permits and variances, covenants, review of masterplans and policies. A large amount of time is spent on referral reviews for building permits, subdivisions, sign permits and communicating with external agencies.

# **Council Discussion:**

- Appreciation for improved planning file timelines.
- Desire to increase commercial development and affordable housing, possible fast-tracking of specific developments needed in the community.
  - Staff advised that a policy would be required for Council's prioritization of applications.
- Request to prioritize the OCP review.

# **HUMAN RESOURCES**

This department manages union bargaining, administers human resources (HR) policies, represents the employer on the Joint Health and Safety committee, handles recruitment, provides support to senior leadership and manages building maintenance.

# **Council Discussion:**

 Clarification that building maintenance is not a usual function of HR and is being managed in this department out of necessity for the time being. A longterm solution is being considered.

# **FINANCE**

This department administers payroll for over 100 employees, processes invoices, manages accounts payable and receivable, issues and collects property taxes, provides external reporting, manages capital assets, coordinates with all municipal departments, ensures accounts reconciliation, prepares and manages the 5-year financial plan, and oversees reception.

#### **Council Discussion:**

- Desire to implement an incentive program for filing homeowner grants and online.
- A reminder that the purchasing policy identifies the preferred use of local vendors only when all other requirements are equal.
- Appreciation for streamlining the tax filing process.

# **INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY**

This department manages the municipal information technology (IT) system for the entire municipality; including 12 sites, 24/7 support for wastewater, security, unified phone system, network management, troubleshooting assistance, and IT equipment purchases.

#### **Council Discussion:**

 The expenditure overages for telephone services are associated with the newly purchased and installed unified telephone system. There will be reduced costs int the future as the service is now in-house and utilizes the internet rather than a service provider.

# **GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SERVICES**

This department collects, analyzes and manages district assets, liaises with BC assessment and land titles, compiles and enters data utilized for mapping, provides amortization entries for finance, completes survey updates and provides internal system support.

#### **Council Discussion:**

- Identified that this department is well utilized by every department.
- Desire to increase and enhance maps available to the public.

# **BUILDING**

This department reviews building applications and plans, issues building permits, and conducts building inspections.

# **Council Discussion:**

• Confirmation that the new Building Regulation Bylaw is in draft form and will be in front of Council in early 2020.

# **ENGINEERING**

This department manages the planning, design, review, construction and maintenance of municipal infrastructure, and contract services where applicable; highway maintenance, line painting, street lighting and traffic control.

# **Council Discussion:**

- Desire to increase street lighting in various poorly lit areas of the community.
  - Staff advised that the addition of a light standard to a hydro pole can be requested, however, ornamental street lighting will carry a significantly greater cost.

# **SUBDIVISION**

This department reviews subdivision and development files, it manages the sewer prepurchase capacity tracking and conducts sewer serviceability reviews. The municipal approving officer resides with this department.

# **PARKS**

This department maintains municipally owned parks, trails, washrooms, boulevards, assess hazard trees, comments on development referrals, and responds to calls for services.

#### **Council Discussion:**

- Concerns with snow and ice removal of sidewalks in the town core, options for an increased budget to accommodate the municipality providing additional service.
  - Staff advised that they have a minimal budget for snow and ice removal which would not cover the costs associated with clearing sidewalks not owned by the municipality.
  - Staff also noted that Parks currently maintains the town core boulevards and due to increased service demands, they will no longer be able to provide this service.
- Desire to see increased information/ publication on parks and trails available in the community.
- The need to review staffing to manage current and new infrastructure, facilities and parklands.

# **WASTEWATER**

This department manages and maintains the sanitary sewer treatment facility and collection systems; manholes, lift stations and piping, ensuring sample analysis is complete and regulatory compliance managed. This past year, a critical parts inventory was complete and a reassessment for 2020 is planned. The new centrifuge has been purchased and will be installed in 2020.

#### **Council Discussion:**

- Confirmation that the old centrifuge will be kept onsite as a backup.
- The sewer expansion is reliant on the completion of the sewer serviceability study, which is underway.
- Desire to receive the cost breakdown for trucking of bio-solids to Hartland.
- Desire to investigate into a metered sewer system based on water consumption.

# **FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICES**

This department provides emergency support services to the community, which includes; public education, fire inspections, review of new subdivisions for access, responding to emergencies, emergency preparedness, and providing mutual aid to neighbouring communities.

- Desire to have analytics and detailed information compiled into a report for the paid-on-call system.
- Agreeance that being prepared for wildfires is a priority.

# **BYLAW**

Mr. Woodward provided an overview of his remediation efforts to the building exterior, expressing concern of unfair treatment by the inclusion of past owners' failure to upkeep the property in the staff report and the negative light cast on him due to this situation. Mr. Woodward requested Council remove or extend the demolition request.

Mayor Tait read aloud the letter provided by Mr. Woodward.

The Bylaw Enforcement Officer noted that due to a procedural error the recommendation is to extend the remedial action for 30 additional days. Noting, that a number of issues have remained outstanding for an extended period of time, such as; structural integrity, fire inspection review and life safety issues.

# **Public Input:**

• There were no contributions from the public.

#### Council Discussion:

- The cost associated with remediating is unknown.
- Lack of schedule from the owner to display plans for remedial efforts.
- Reiteration that Council supported Option A at the September 9, 2019, Regular Council meeting, which included the demolition and removal of the building no later than 30 days after notice of remedial action.
- There is extensive work, and associated costs, required to bring the property into compliance.
- Councillor McMath was opposed to proceeding with the demolition recommending a larger extension of time for Mr. Woodward to prepare a schedule and complete remedial work.
  - The Chief Administrative Officer advised Council that for the building to come into compliance a registered professional, at the initiation and cost of Mr. Woodward, should have already scheduled works to be completed and an associated timeline. However, this remains unprepared or presented to the District, as of this meeting.
- The process for repayment for remedial action, executed by the District, would fall onto the owner and if unpaid, the outstanding invoice would be added to the property taxes.

Malcolm McNaughton, Director of Development for BC Housing (Vancouver Island) provided a PowerPoint presentation and overview of the housing spectrum addressed by various BC Housing programs. The Building BC stream addresses homelessness, housing with supportive services, and social housing while the Housing Hub stream includes affordable rental housing and affordable homeownership. Housing Hub also includes a Community Housing fund, an Indigenous Housing fund, a Supportive Housing fund and a Women's Transition Housing fund. Mr. McNaughton also spoke to the Regional Housing First partnership between BC Housing, the CRD and the Canadian Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC), which will fund several upcoming projects in Sooke.

#### Council discussion:

- Several housing projects are underway in Sooke that access BC Housing funds. Clarification as to whether Sooke is eligible for funding of additional projects that might arise.
- Mr. McNaughton explained the assessment criteria used to evaluate funding requests and suggested any new project should demonstrate solutions to an issue addressed in the Housing Needs Assessment and have a reputable operator in order to be considered.
- Anticipated timelines for 2020 funding.
- Mr. McNaughton stated he was happy to work with staff to provide feedback on any proposed project until such time as call for funding applications is issued.

# 12.1. Firearms and Bow Use Bylaw No. 659, 2019

The Bylaw Enforcement & Compliance Officer provided an overview of the written staff report, recommending amendment of Bylaw No. 659, *Firearms and Bow Use Bylaw*, 2019. In response to a question from the Public Question and Comment Period, clarification was provided that it is common practice across municipalities to restrict firearms and bow use to larger lots in the Agricultural Land Reserve (ALR).

#### Council discussion:

- Further clarification regarding larger lots in ALR and safe use of firearms and hows
- Concern that hobby farmers on smaller lots outside of the ALR are still affected by crop damage but limited by the bylaw.
- Federally licensed use of a registered firearm is subject to safety restrictions under the *Firearms Act* and *Criminal Code*. Additional restrictions may not deter people who choose to use firearms unsafely but may add unnecessary restrictions to safe use.
- Clarification regarding intent and history of bylaw. Originally brought forward at request of CRD Director Hicks regarding geese, with concerns arising around bow hunting of deer on Whiffin Spit at the same time. Bylaw attempts to address both issues.
- Process of bylaw contravention complaint would involve RCMP and Conservation Officers as necessary.
- Concern that bylaw restricts activity protected under the Right to Farm Act.
- Staff have received a legal opinion on the bylaw, which will be circulated to Council.

- Desire to empower committees with a clear understanding of what will happen with the work they produce.
- Establish a reporting structure that allows for two-way conversation on regular basis between committees and Council.
- Staff support for committees helps to facilitate information flow but capacity to support many committees is limited.
- Option to combine committees with very specific mandates into larger umbrella committees.
- November 2016 Council discussion regarding committee structure yielded suggestion of three larger committees: Community Safety and Protective Services, Community Development, and Arts and Culture. Proposed structure did not receive Council support at the time. May be an option for future consideration.
- Committee mandates should not create redundancy between committees and staff.

# 5.1. Draft 2020-2024 Five Year Financial Plan

The Chief Administrative Officer outlined the process for the budget meeting.

The Acting Director of Financial Services provided an overview of the draft 2020-2024 Five Year Financial Plan, highlighting the following:

- Legislation governing municipal government;
- · Financial planning and accounting process;
- Cost implications to the budget include; population growth, historically low taxes, inadequate asset maintenance in the past years, and an increased call volume associated with increased population.
- Revenue is generated through property taxes, sewer parcel taxes, fees & charges for service, Development Cost Charges (DCC's) and internal transfers or grants from other government agencies.
- Expenses are identified through the operations of each department, debt, capital, and reserve transfers. The following was highlighted:
  - The District collects funds through the property taxes for external agencies such as the Capital Regional District (CRD), hospitals, Sooke School District (SD62) and the Vancouver Island Regional Library (VIRL).
  - The proposed property tax increase is reflective of an increase in staff; three (3) new full-time positions and two (2) Auxiliary staff, outside agency funding requests, internal department requests, and District Plans underway or requiring annual review.
- The associated risks with the budget include; maintaining and hiring staff, unknown costs related to building condition assessment, past heavy reliance on reserves, cost of maintaining existing sewer system and expansion decision, aging infrastructure, and rapid community growth.
- There are opportunities to obtain additional funding through grants, permits, fees, potential cannabis revenue, and increased development.
  - o These opportunities are not yet reflective of the currently presented budget.
- Impacts from the Service Level Review:
- E-bike for Bylaw, capital cost through the use of the carbon tax rebate reserve and there will be a minimal operating cost for associated safety equipment.
- A sewer surcharge by water usage will be reviewed and a report to Council in mid-late 2020

- The two (2) new auxiliary park workers to manage new infrastructure.
- The street lighting assessment will be managed within the existing budget.
- Community grant funding for 2019 was an anomaly with a very generous budget; it was suggested that this line item not increase.
- The Council contingency was reviewed, and it was suggested that Council manage requests and prioritize within the recommended amount.
- The District will not renew the town core parking lease
- External Agency Requests included:
  - School District 62 = \$9,000 for additional crossing guard.
  - Police Victim Services = \$20,000 increase on top of the current \$8,000, with a 2% increase every year.
  - EMCS theater seats = \$45,000 (District of Sooke 1/3, School District 1/3, fundraising 1/3).

The Acting Director of Finance reviewed each department's requested increases, decreases, or changes to their individual budget. The proposed 2020 capital projects were provided with associated costs and funding sources. Finally, Council was advised on how the budget as presented will assist them in achieving the goals outlined in the 2019-2022 Council Strategic Plan.

The Chief Administrative Officer provided an overview of the next steps of the budget process, advising that comments from this meeting and the open house session on January 22, 2020, would be included in the next reading of the bylaw.

#### **Council Discussion:**

- Desire to review the budget line by line, through each department, to ensure clarity for themselves and the public.
- The need for the most up-to-date version of the budget to actuals reports for 2019, prior to 3rd reading.
- Confirmation that new positions included in the budget were identified in the service level review and organizational review, accepted by Council.
- Concerns with the use of a planning consultant budget item, prefer staff request funds from Council Contingency or the CAO's Contingency.
- The specifics associated with a Fire Consultant Master Plan are desired for the consideration of funding.

- Costs associated with office furniture and ergonomic assessments for staff.
- The tax rate increase includes all internal and external requests.
- Desire to ensure contributions to reserve funds are adequate.

  - Reduction of Council travel budget;
  - Reduction in Community Grant funding;
  - o Addition of a Climate Action line item in the budget;
  - o Reduce contribution to EMCS theater seats;
  - o Remove or reduce the sponsorship line;
  - o Increase the Council Contingency; and
  - Review of all outside organization requests.

Chief Kenn Mount

The Director of Community Safety/Fire Chief provided a PowerPoint presentation and update on Fire Department and Emergency Services programs. An overview of capital projects and operational activities was presented, as well as an update on annual call volume, which is on par with previous years. The Chief reported 490 calls to date, most of which were medical 'C' and 'D' level calls; 15 structure fires; 6 chimney fires; 66 Motor Vehicle Incidents and 95 burning complaints. The average call time is 1.2 hours with total call time as 357 hours.
