



Highway 14 - Sooke Town Center Pedestrian Enhancement Project

July 2020

The Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure intends to enhance pedestrian infrastructure in Sooke along Highway 14 between Otter Point Rd and Atherley Close Rd.

The pedestrian enhancement project is part of the suite of Highway 14 corridor improvements announced in January 2018. These improvements include transit pullouts and a queue-jump lane, safety signs, new Gillespie Road two-lane bridge, Sooke River Road intersection upgrade, Muir Creek slow-moving vehicle pullout and Sombrio rest area.

Rehabilitation Works

The proposed scope includes:

- Installing new concrete and paving stone sidewalks;
- Constructing east and westbound bus pullouts;
- Improving infrastructure for cyclists; and,
- Installing a new crosswalk near Ed MacGregor Park and the Gateway Trail.

Project Benefits

The proposed enhancements will:

- Improve safety for all users of the road, including vehicles, cyclists and pedestrians; and,
- Benefit area residents, businesses and the community.

Project Status

A construction contract for the \$1.2-million project has been awarded to Ramida Enterprises Ltd. from Sooke.

Construction is anticipated to start in August of 2020 and targeting completion in the Fall of 2020.
