Peter Mouck addressed Council and spoke regarding a proposed independent energy infrastructure upgrade and the "Illuminate the Way" campaign. Mr. Mouck indicated he would send additional information to Council and requested that upon further review of the proposal, Council provide letters of support and approval.

7.3 Firearms & Bow Use Bylaw Issues from E. Boucher

Eric Boucher addressed Council and spoke regarding his concerns with the proposed Bylaw No. 659, *Firearms and Bow Use Bylaw*. Mr. Boucher suggested that existing Federal and Provincial legislation provide adequate regulation of Firearms and Bow Use and that Council should withdraw the Bylaw and re-focus on the issue of non-migratory bird control and crop protection.

7.4 Firearms & Bow Use Bylaw - Connie Road Carle and Roth

Krista Carle addressed Mayor and Council and spoke regarding her experience as an agricultural producer and keeper of livestock. Ms. Carle encouraged Council to consider that hunters protect the food security of the community and also keep deer populations lowered, potentially reducing the number of vehicle accidents as a result of collisions with deer.

9. PUBLIC HEARINGS AND RELATED BYLAWS

9.1 Report of Public Hearing - 2110 & 2120 Church Road

• Bylaw No. 641, Zoning Amendment Bylaw (600-27)

The Development Services department provided an overview of the zoning amendment.

Mayor Tait called the Public Hearings for Bylaw No. 641 to order at 7:49 p.m.

Mayor Tait advised that any person who believes that their interest in property is affected by the proposed bylaws would be given a reasonable opportunity to be heard or to present written submissions at the public hearing.

Public Submissions:

- <u>Ellen Lewers</u>, Sooke resident, addressed Council and spoke on behalf
 of a neighboring property owner. Ms. Lewers asked for clarification
 regarding a road right of way along the south edge of Wadams Way.
 Ms. Lewers provided additional comment on the need to ensure
 drainage is adequately addressed.
- <u>Jennifer Smith</u>, Sooke resident, addressed Council and inquired as to how the affordable housing component of the project will be ensured.
 Ms. Smith expressed concern that the current property owners could sell to another developer, who would benefit from the bylaw amendments and not build affordable housing units. Ms. Smith also inquired as to why the RM-4 zone is also recommended by staff in addition to the amendments to the CD-11 zone.
- The Development Services staff provided clarity regarding consistency between zones and assurances of amenity space, which is provided by the RM-4 zone.
- <u>Joe Newell.</u> of Joe Newell Architects (project applicant) provided additional information concerning the proposed development. The project is bound by an agreement with BC Housing, and by the Knox Vision Society's mandate to provide affordable housing.
- Gord Kouwenberg, pastor of Knox Presbyterian Church, provided additional information that the BC Housing agreement is for a 25-year period and that the constitution of the Knox Vision Society prevents the sale of the property.

Mayor Tait called two additional times for submissions to the Public Hearing regarding Bylaw No. 641 and hearing none, the public hearing was closed at 8:09 pm.

5. DELEGATIONS

5.1. Structured Water - James Duggan

Mr. Duggan addressed Council and spoke regarding possible improvements to the hydrating properties of drinking water. Mr. Duggan provided examples of how water can be revitalized, and made to be more "alive" with fewer contaminants. Mr. Duggan encouraged Council to research the issue and to consider installing communal water pumps throughout the community that have revitalizing water infrastructure installed.

6. PUBLIC QUESTION AND COMMENT PERIOD

Council heard from the following members of the public:

- <u>Jeff Bateman</u>, Sooke resident, spoke in support of Electric Vehicle Charging Stations.
- <u>Ellen Lewers</u>, Sooke resident, inquired as to costs for hosting the Tourism Vancouver Island 2018 Conference, the upcoming Local Government Leadership Academy and the funding for the Canada 150 Banners.

7. PUBLIC HEARINGS AND RELATED BYLAWS

7.1. Bylaw No. 558, Zoning Amendment Bylaw (600-3) - 1781 Minnie Road & 7057 West Coast Road

The Development Services department provided a Power Point presentation and overview of the written staff report.

Herb Haldane, applicant, spoke to Council and indicated that the intention is to develop larger lots than is permitted by the proposed rezoning, while not restricting future owners who may wish to further subdivide should sewer infrastructure reach the area in the future.

Acting Mayor Kasper called the Public Hearing for Bylaw No. 558 to order at 7:18 p.m.

Acting Mayor Kasper advised that any person who believes that their interest in property is affected by the proposed bylaw would be given a reasonable opportunity to be heard or to present written submissions at the Public Hearing.

Public Submissions:

- <u>Steven Powell</u>, Sooke resident, spoke regarding his concerns with the increased density Bylaw No. 558 permits, which he feels is out of proportion with nearby properties.
- <u>Laura Gorse</u>, Sooke resident, spoke regarding concerns as to the high water table in the area and potential flooding on neighbouring properties. Ms. Gorse expressed further concern regarding the sensitive ecosystem surrounding Wright Road Creek and the impact that development may have on this area.
- James Duggan, Sooke resident, spoke regarding the importance of protecting waterways and encouraged Council to seek advice from water experts before proceeding.
- Gail Hall, Sooke resident, spoke regarding the history of Bylaw No. 558 and the
 documentation included in the Public Hearing package, which spans 2013 2017. Ms. Hall further stated that according to the District's own solicitor, a
 bylaw must stand on its own merit and not depend on a master document,
 which she does not feel is the case with Bylaw No. 558.
- <u>Ellen Lewers</u>, Sooke resident, spoke regarding the length of time that has
 passed since Bylaw No. 558 received first and second reading in 2013, under a
 different Council. Ms. Lewers expressed concern that Council does not have
 enough information regarding the proposed rezoning. Ms. Lewers further
 inquired as to the future of the riparian area.

Acting Mayor Kasper called a second time for public submissions to the Public Hearing regarding Bylaw No. 558.

- <u>Ellen Lewers</u>, Sooke resident, expressed concern regarding potential flooding on neighbouring properties and the importance of enhancing natural waterways, rather than destroying them.
- <u>Laura Gorse</u>, Sooke resident, stated that she has observed non-native soil used as fill on the subject property, which she feels is leeching into tributary waters.
- <u>James Duggan</u>, Sooke resident, encouraged Council to protect the waterways in the area.

Acting Mayor Kasper called a third time for public submissions to the Public Hearing regarding Bylaw No. 558. Hearing none, the Public Hearing was closed at 7:38 pm.

Public Submission:

- <u>Ellen Lewers</u>, Sooke Resident, commented on the following: Lot A is a far reach to be identified as town centre. Community members approached District to have their property be purchased for the Library, were these not included for review? Focus should be on seaside development of community. Wadams Way was supposed to be a bypass, now a driveway onto it will create more stopped traffic in area. Needs for Seniors and performing arts. Costs of land and Vancouver Island Regional Land investment into the property.
- <u>Debora Barclay</u>, Sooke Resident, spoke regarding Wadams Way bypass access to the property. Commercial/ residential/ institutional mix height restrictions at location. Enquired as to availability to plans from the Vancouver Island Regional Library area usage and building.

Council and Staff addressed:

- New facility conversations have been occurring for the past 10 year;
- A vellow flashing light at close to Townsend to be installed:
- Vancouver Island Regional Library (VIRL) slated to be a single-story building;
- Identified that the VIRL board is separate from the District;

- <u>Gail Hall</u>, Sooke Resident, spoke inquiring about next steps for the property and whether every new usage of the property required additional Public Hearings; concerns with next restrictions on new spaces/ buildings. A process to provide assurance to those who live next to this lot. Whether the District is servicing the property or the Vancouver Island Regional Library Board.

8. PUBLIC HEARINGS AND RELATED BYLAWS

8.1. Bylaw No. 675, Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 675 (600-39) - 7004 Melrick Place

The Planner II provided a PowerPoint presentation and overview of the proposed development, recommending Council give third reading to Bylaw No. 675, *Zoning Amendment Bylaw No.* 675 (600-39) for 7004 Melrick Place.

Council Discussion:

- Whether the affordable housing requirement would be met was debated, as suites would be optional.
- The parking requirements were addressed at the September 11th, 2017 meeting, with support for option #4. Ensuring that ample and sufficient parking areas would be provided for the units proposed.

Mayor Tait read a written statement advising that any person who believes their interest in the property is affected by the prosed bylaw, would be given a reasonable

opportunity to be heard and to have their written submission presented at the Public Hearing.

Mayor Tait called the Public Hearing for Bylaw No. 675, *Zoning Amendment Bylaw No.* 675 (600-39) for 7004 Melrick Place to order at 7:10 p.m.

Public Submissions:

- <u>Ellen Lewers</u>, 5526 Sooke Road, spoke in opposition of the rezoning at 7004 Melrick Place, and would like to see a community garden requirement for this subdivision. Ms. Lewers inquired about soil removal resulting in water or drainage issues, soil disposal and replacement.
- Linda White, 6998 Melrick Place, spoke regarding the small size of the proposed lots creating a higher density in the area. Ms. White expressed concern about soil removal and tree line stability, alignment of the proposed lots with the current properties and what would adjoin these properties. A solid fence between the development and adjoining properties, to ensure beautification, would be appreciated. The blasting disruptions, dust issues, protection for homeowners, work time-frames and notification also brought apprehension regarding the development. Ms. White expressed concern about the excessive blasting and excavator noise, with constant construction. The traffic increase on the roads leading to this location, and a request for larger lot sizes to decrease the number of lots. She also expressed a preference for a continual fence, between current properties and those that will adjoin hers.
- In response to questions, the Director of Development Services stated:
 - A geotechnical engineer will ensure compliance for rock removal and placement.
- Ed Berlando, 6995 Allwood Terrace, spoke to the size of the lots, suites increasing the density, and proportions of house size to lot. Mr. Berlando expressed concern with a large rock that adjoins his property to a proposed lot, removal would result in damage to his home. Additional concerns relating to tree lines, soil remove, dust control, and road width for emergency vehicle access were also brought forward. He inquired about projected elevation changes and the amount of blasting to achieve requirements. Mr. Berlando inquired about a lot size guarantee. Clarity from staff was provided, that lot sizes have not been confirmed, this public hearing is only for the rezoning of the land, to adjust for greater infill and minimal lots allowed to the maximum density permitted by the zone.
 - The Fire Chief addressed the road width concern stating that the developer will be required to meet Emergency Vehicle access standards.

 - Affordable housing not met if suites are not allowed. The small size of the lots and houses ensures reasonable opportunities for entry into housing market.
- In response to questions, the Director of Development Services stated:
 - The removal of soil requires a permit. A grading plan, including the end grade, is required with the Development Permit. As well an extensive drainage plan will be a prerequisite to development.

The Public Hearing was closed at 7:56 p.m.

Public Submissions:

- <u>Ellen Lewers</u>, 5226 Sooke Road, spoke in opposition of the rezoning at 5229
 Sooke Road, with regards to the traffic and safety issues with left turns into this property from the highway.
- <u>Sifu Moonfist</u>, 6591 Lincroft Road, spoke regarding the visibility issues at this location, and that the brush needs to be trimmed down to maintain clear sightlines.

7.2. Bylaw No. 687, Zoning Amendment Bylaw (600-48) - 6599 Arranwood Drive

The Planner II provided a PowerPoint presentation and overview of the proposed development, recommending Council give Third reading to Bylaw No. *Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 687 (600-48)* for 6599 Arranwood Drive, to rezone from Neighbourhood Commercial (C1) to partial C1 and Medium Density (RM2). Also recommending the owner enter into a section 219 covenant that limits the height of future development to 3 storeys up to a maximum of 12 meters on this portion of the property.

Council Discussion:

- The driveway and the garage location pose a to meet parking requirements, and it is perceived that it is not actually provide two functional parking spaces.
- With the approximate selling price of the units not being available, it is difficult to assess if the affordable housing provision is being met.
- There was concern regarding density, which the applicant clarified by assuring each townhouse would be no more than 2 floors.

The applicant was invited to address comments and inquiries.

- <u>Blair Robertson</u>, applicant for the development at 6599 Arranwood Drive, provided the following:
 - The parking shown on the plan is a conceptual design and there will be additional parking for visitors.
 - Determination of a range or target price point for these proposed units is approximately 2-3 years away as it will be dependent on the everchanging market. It is difficult to present an actual dollar value at this point.
 - Modified housing was initially planned in 2005; with the addition of a commercial option there will be a reduction in future area density.

Mayor Tait read a written statement advising that any person who believes their interest in the property is affected by the proposed bylaw, would be given a reasonable opportunity to be heard and to have their written submission presented at the Public Hearing.

Mayor Tait called the Public Hearing for the Bylaw No. 687, *Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 687 (600-48)* for 6599 Arranwood Drive to order at 7:41 p.m.

Public Submissions:

<u>Katie McLaughlin</u>, 113-6591 Arranwood Drive, spoke in opposition of the proposed changes at 6599 Arranwood Drive, highlighting her submitted comments. The concerns she has with the proposed development are already apparent and will only increase with this development; sidewalk safety, increased vehicle traffic, lack of set-backs, poor visibility, and lack of privacy. Ms. McLaughlin requested Council consider requiring an easement between the Alders properties and the proposed development.

- Graeme Bartle, 119-6591 Arranwood Drive, addressed the letter submitted by his strata. Mr. Bartle expressed concern with the density increase, and that the proposed units have a greater square footage than the units on the neighbouring development. He also noted that parking is already limited, with the garage blocking in driveway access for most units, there is no room in the laneway to park anywhere else. Mr. Bartle had safety concerns with the proximity between the proposed development and the Alder units, wondering is the access would be sufficient if there was a fire in the rear of either property. Finally, he mentioned there are landscaping limitations with the proximity of homes, and more space between units would allow for residents to plant a privacy barrier.
- <u>Gregory Varano</u>, 105-6591 Arranwood Drive, spoke in opposition of the
 proposed development at 6599 Arranwood Drive and agreed with previous
 comments by other homeowners from his strata. Mr. Varano supports The
 Alders strata request for an easement to increase privacy, noting that the Fir
 trees on the property are an asset and would like to see these remain. Mr.
 Varano expressed concern with how the affordable housing portion of the
 development would be implemented.
- Herb Haldane, 3118C Otter Point Road, spoke in regard to lack of consistency between rezoning applications and sought clarity on how the affordable housing component for this development would be addressed. Mr. Haldane echoed resident's complaints that parking is not adequate for the area.
- <u>Chris Secord</u>, 115-6591 Arranwood Drive, spoke in opposition of the proximity of the proposed development at 6599 Arranwood Drive, which is at the back of his property. He would like to be assured that privacy will be maintained, suggesting a buffer. Mr. Secord discussed the drainage concerns that created with the varied elevations between properties. There would be increased parking issues and Mr. Secord wondered how regulations would be enforced.
- <u>Derrick Church</u>, 107-6591 Arranwood Drive, spoke in opposition of the rezoning of 6599 Arranwood Drive. Expressing his reason for living in the area, Mr. Church would be disappointed with a change in the environment adjoining their property. Mr. Church agreed with his fellow neighbour's fear that parking would not be sufficient for the area. Finally, he expressed his apprehension that privacy would be eliminated for those in The Alders strata should this development proceed.

The applicant was invited to address comments and inquiries.

- <u>Blair Robertson</u>, applicant for the development at 6599 Arranwood Drive, stated:
 - The design is a conceptual sketch, not a final plan and the number of units is not concrete.
 - It is the intent of the developer to ensure adequate parking is allocated, and that these units will not have suites.

 The concerns of the neighbours have been heard, and there can be an increase from the minimum setbacks to generate a larger separation between properties. The easement option is not viable as smaller units will decrease the ability to implement the proposed building plan.

The Public Hearing was closed at 8:54 p.m.

10. PUBLIC HEARINGS AND RELATED BYLAWS

10.1. Bylaw No. 686, Zoning Amendment Bylaw (600-47) - 2150 Melrick Place

The Planner II provided a PowerPoint presentation and overview of the proposed development, recommending Council give Third reading to Bylaw No. 686, Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 686 (600-47), 2017 for 2150 Melrick Place, to rezone the property from Large Lot Residential (R1) to Small Lot Residential (R3).

Mayor Tait read a written statement advising that any person who believes their interest in the property is affected by the proposed bylaw, would be given a reasonable opportunity to be heard and to have their written submission presented at the Public Hearing.

Mayor Tait called the Public Hearing for Bylaw No. 686, *Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 686 (600-47)* for 2150 Melrick Place to order at 7:13 p.m.

Public Submissions:

- Gus Van Arendonk, 2123 Melrick PI, expressed his concerns regarding adequate parking, increased noise and traffic in the area, and questioned the long-term impact on existing residents with this development.
- Allan Dolan, 2119 Melrick Place, addressed Council asking them to consider the other application on Melrick, as the density increases in an environmentally sensitive area. Mr. Dolan encourages green space for wildlife habitat and privacy for the neighbourhood be maintained.
- In response to questions about storm water management, the Planner II stated:
 - At the time of subdivision, the bylaw identifies, specific standards that are in place to ensure drainage doesn't affect neighbouring properties
- <u>Linda White</u>, 6998 Melrick Place, spoke regarding lot size decrease in a
 established neighbourhood where lots are double the size of the proposed
 development. Ms. White requested that the aesthetics of the area, parking
 concerns, and the increase pressure on the infrastructure be taken into
 consideration.
- <u>Ed Berlando</u>, 6995 Allwood Terrace, expressed his concerns with minimal lot size compared to the surrounding area, fire hazard access and suggested an additional hydrant in area.
- In response to questions regarding area densification, the Planner II stated:
 - The area is designated for community residential use, a designation that permits low to medium density. The small lot residential zone, a zone that permits lots smaller than 500m sq, would fit within the medium density community residential designation.

The Public Hearing was closed at 7:34 p.m.

Council Discussion:

- There is concern that the affordable housing option, of secondary suites, does
 not meet the current need in the community, with the rental market value
 increasing and limited options for those with animals and children.
- Parking issues could arise due to the number of houses proposed, in comparison to the number of parking spaces.
- There is dissatisfaction with continued infill outside of the town core.
- The desire for increased green space for wildlife, and residents of the neighbourhood was discussed.
- Details of the covenant were debated:
 - o 1 visitor stall for every 2 lots.
 - o Suites would need additional onsite parking.

- In response to guestions, the Planner II stated:
 - There is an option to share an existing road, which would create 7 lots.
 Without the road share, there will be 6 lots and the developer will be required to create their own road.
 - Fire concerns will be addressed at the time of subdivision to ensure adequate access.
 - An assurance that the Zoning Bylaw will provide adequate review of all of Council's concerns.
