11.1. Application Process and Development Tracking

The Director of Planning and Development gave a PowerPoint presentation and overview of the current status of development application processing. Flowcharts

outlining subdivision, building, and planning application processes were provided and opportunities for improvements and additional tracking identified. A review of the District's development process is included in Council's Strategic Priorities.

Council discussion:

- Value transparency and automation of information to ensure timely notification.
- Appreciate online mapping options and visual indicators to show the progress of applications.
- Incomplete and deficient applications are time-consuming and frustrating for applicants as well as staff.
- Reasons for challenges with processing applications in a timely manner and meeting service level expectations. Staff positions in the organizational chart have been filled. Are current resources sufficient?
- Staff clarified that a backlog of applications has existed for some time and efforts to address the backlog and catch up with current applications are underway.
- Improved public education and communication tools, including online tracking, are proposed to help address the backlog and redirect staff resources to the processing of applications.
- OCP process will consider targeted commercial and industrial land development, as well as consider policy on rural development.
- Council goal to build a reputable organization includes both excellent public service provision and ensuring staff are adequately resourced.

11.2. Climate Adaptation & Mitigation Strategy Report

The Chief Administrative Officer gave an overview of the written staff report. Since Council declared a Climate Emergency in the District of Sooke on April 8, 2019, staff have been seeking a means to operationalize a response. Several provincial and regional reports have been published that provide environmental scans and strategies for communities to address the climate crisis. As the newly formed Climate Action Committee and Community Economic Development Committee begin their work, staff are seeking direction from Council to provide these committees with a framework for their discussions and work throughout their upcoming terms of appointment.

Council discussion:

 Staff recommendation is for a Climate Adaptation and Mitigation Strategy to be moved into the "now" section of Council's Strategic Priorities. Council to prioritize outstanding items at January 18 meeting.

- Food literacy and food security were identified by the outgoing Climate Action Committee as target areas for climate action yet are not identified as a risk at a provincial level.
- Social mobilization is needed to create change. People know the right choices to make but creating a culture of change is a struggle.
- Sooke has a diverse population and engaged community, this could be a great model to demonstrate climate adaptation and mitigation.



5.2. <u>Development Variance Permit - 7044 Maple Park Terrace</u>

The Director of Planning & Development provided an overview of the written staff report seeking approval from Council for staff to work with the applicant to achieve an acceptable road grade transition for a portion of Brailsford Place.

Mr. Wignall, a representative for the developer, provided an overview of the project, a historical timeline and past communication with the District, which has led them to the 15% road grade which is currently in place.

Council discussion:

- Concerns were expressed that there were no formal design drawings received by the District in advance of the developer beginning road construction.
- The developer must have been aware that a variance would be required to alter the road grade, as it is a requirement in the municipal bylaw.

- Staff have been requested to manage the growth of neighbourhoods and impacts on residents, there are quality standards that must be adhered to.
- There have been ongoing challenges with this development, such as blasting and dust issues, and the desire is to complete the development to provide peace for the neighbours.

Public input:

- <u>lan Lang</u>, the applicant, spoke to connectivity with multiple entries into the development, money loss by sitting idle, and advised that there are only 2 options; Rip out pipes and readjust for 12% or be allowed to transition, for 35 meters.
- <u>William Wallace</u>, a Sooke resident, spoke in opposition to the development due to the environmental impacts.

Council discussion:

- The applicant would not be able to return to Council if this is defeated. Ideally, if the applicant submits detailed design drawings which staff find acceptable, then the variance could be brought forward at a later date.
- Concerns were raised regarding the District's liability with a 15% grade.
- Desire to work with applicant to evaluate options, and work in good faith.
- Reducing the grade in this one location will greatly affect a large portion of the development.
- Lack of appreciation for the developer moving ahead without submitting approved design drawings.
- Support for a mix of road grading, but only with staff approval.

Staff advised that anything less than the current 15% road grade would result in the removal of installed utilities and advised that the developer began the construction of the road at their own risk.

- The municipality's borrowing allowance is 25% of the revenue total and needs to be balanced throughout multiple years and projects.

Chief Administrative Office

- Being prepared for grant opportunities is dependant on having shelf-ready projects.
- Concerns with climate action initiatives being invested in by multiple municipalities and the duplication of work. There may be opportunities to share resources that should be investigated.
- Importance of local job creation to reduce vehicles on the roads.

Corporate Services

• This year includes an election, which is not annually funded, resulting in an increase over previous years.

Finance

 Minimal room to trim any budget items, as the proposal reflects general increases that need to be included as a part of conducting business.

Planning

 Concerns with allocating funding for the development of additional plans and policies identified in the draft Official Community Plan, prior to its final adoption.

Engineering

- Difficulties in distinguishing which critical repairs should be implemented and others left for future years.
- Importance of taking advantage of opportunities, to reduce costs as they arise, and the difficulties in anticipating what will be the key priorities.
- Increased communication with the public on where their tax dollars are spent and identifying portions funded by grants or other sources.
- Infrastructure has been historically neglected, improvements and repairs need to be conducted to ensure the community is serviced appropriately.

Policing

The imminent cost to the municipality once the census is complete, there will

Fire

- Wildfire funding received from the province could be utilized in the future to pay down debt servicing or be put into reserve funds for future fire department purchases.
- Expectations and retention of volunteer members are changing, the future of the paid-on-call program could continue to exist but the reliance on the current program may need to change.
- There are currently three (3) outstanding debts being financed for fire department vehicles.
- The Firemaster plan is currently being prepared, this will include a long-term staffing plan, internal recruitment, recommendations on plans, and the identification of challenges that exist and mechanisms to implement change.
- The benefit of a mechanic being able to work inhouse, for regular maintenance, opposed to bringing vehicles into Victoria and being out of commission for an extended period

General Discussion:

- No intent to adopt a budget with a 17% increase but understand the need to adopt a budget that will address inflation and community needs.
- Reliance on-staff expertise to develop a reasonable budget that provides quality services but does not heavily tax the residents.

5. BYLAWS

2022-2026 Five Year Financial Plan

The Director of Finance presented the 2022-2026 Five Year Financial Plan report. The goal of the plan is to meet the requirements of Council's strategic plan, the recent service level review, the public, and staff, with a focus on the initiatives recommended by the Transportation Master Plan.

In response to questions, staff advised that:

- Previously, a Parks staff position was funded by the Covid Reserve fund. However, that funding is finite and the cost of staffing that position must be absorbed into the budget.
- VoterView is an elector management system that will increase transparency, efficiency, voter safety, and facilitate the ability to update the elector list dynamically from multiple polling locations for advance polls or on election day. The software license will be valid for one year.
- The work of the Community Economic Development Officer position has been reviewed and will be assigned to the Manager of Planning (new position). This new staff person's work will include addressing non-residential growth and the employment lands as identified in the OCP.
- Funding for a new RCMP officer is included in future years' budgets.
- The federal Community-Building Fund payments increase at a pre-determined rate each year. The budget assumes that another federal funding program will replace it in 2025/2026.
- E-Comm expenses are not included in this budget.
- The Fire Department's budget request is lower than originally proposed because there are now fewer paid on call members.
- The implementation of the transportation master plan will result in increased active transportation options and safety, improved storm water management infrastructure, better traffic management, repaired roads, and the reduction of GHG emissions. It is important to support this work now to ensure that the District is prepared to accept additional financing options when they become available (grants and loans). Also, savings can be realized by scheduling work in unison with the Waddams Way developers. A 6.09 percent tax increase over three years will ensure the establishment of a reserve fund to secure a loan in the future.
