Welcome! Paws at the Park


 **Pick up after your pet. Use the provided bin to help keep the park clean.**

 **All dogs must have up-to-date vaccines and be in good health.**


 **Your puppy is not ready for the park until they are at least four months old and fully vaccinated.**


 **All dogs must be wearing a current dog licence tag.**

 **Do not bring your dog if she is in heat.**

 **Keep your leash with you. Even in off-leash parks, you may need to remove your dog from a situation (e.g. excited play and aggressive dog interactions).**

 **Remove excessively loud or aggressive dogs immediately.**

 **Be cautious with dog toys, or don't bring them. Be mindful if your dog is not keen to share.**

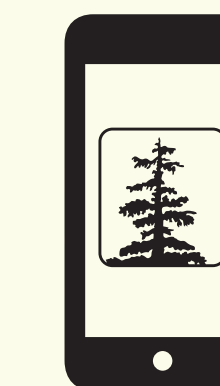
 **Owners are legally responsible for the behaviour of their dog(s) at all times.**

 **Securely latch gate after entering and exiting.**

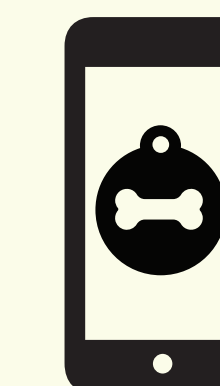

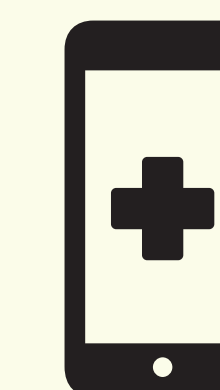

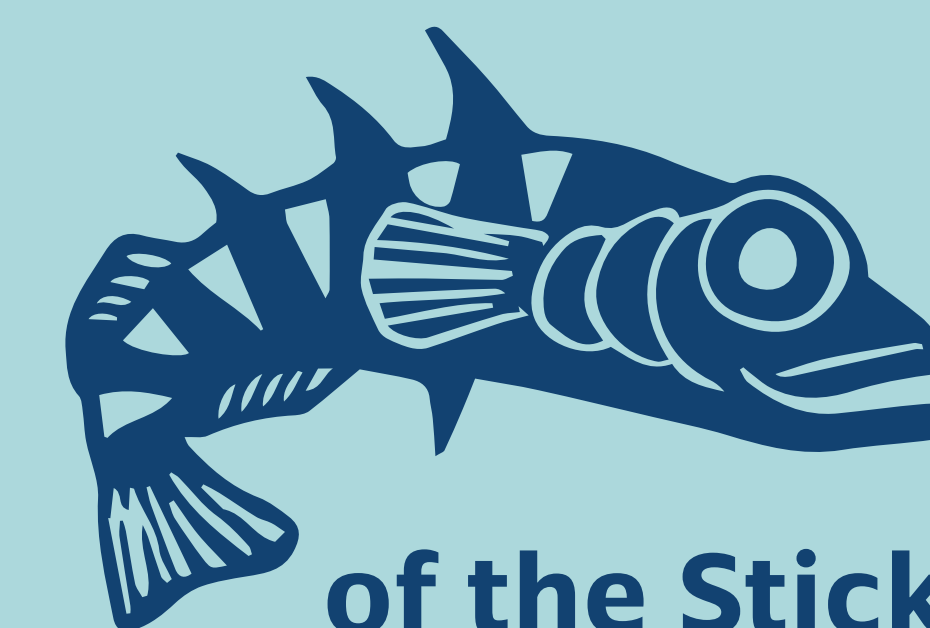
