The word T'Sou-ke *tsa-awk* is the name of the Stickleback fish found in the estuary of the Sooke River in the SENĆOŦEN *sənčáθən* language of the T'Sou-ke Nation. The anglicized name of T'Sou-ke is Sooke.



The District of Sooke & the Juan de Fuca Community Trails Society acknowledges the Stickleback Trail is located on the unceded Coast Salish Territory of the T'Sou-ke Nation.
