Mayor Macgregor announced that this public meeting was held to consider the application to remove the west side of the John Phillips Memorial Golf Course from the Agriculture Land Reserve.

Mayor Macgregor noted that Council had received and considered the following written submissions:

Council also received two petitions:

- 1. "We the undersigned would like to express our profound support for the long term care facility and senior housing project proposed by the Capital Region Hospital Society and the Milt Gibson Memorial Society to be built on the golf course property. The long term benefits to the community far outway any issues of greenspace. We understand that the golf course will be modified to a shorter nine holes and therefore will still be available to those who wish to golf." 232 signatures
- 2. "As a long time resident of Sooke I feel that the current proposal for the golf course is very unwise. If these types of facilities have to be built in Sooke then lets find a more suitable place and leave the golf course as a part of the community." 32 signatures

Mayor Macgregor asked Mr. Jeremy Tate of the Capital Regional District (co-applicant) to address Council. Mr. Tate explained that this was the first step of approval and the project would return to Council for rezoning and to amend the OCP. Mr. Tate explained the site selection process that was undertaken and that the golf course site was the highest scored site, in part due to the lower costs for services. He noted that Provincial approval is required and that the timing is good now.

Mr. Ray Mostaway, president of the Milt Gibson Memorial Society (co-applicant), introduced the Society and its association with the Lions Club. Mr. Mostaway explained why this facility is necessary for the community.

Mr. Gilles Huizinga, Retirement Living Communities (for the applicant), explained the conceptual project plan, the financial benefit, services required for seniors, and the physical characteristics of the facility which consist of an extended care facility, seniors' housing, a health centre and park area. Mr. Huizinga noted that 75% of this property would be open space.

Mr. Brian French, an agrologist and soil specialist hired by the Milt Gibson Memorial Society (for the applicant), stated that he had taken soil samples from the property in question and found that 82% of the property had poor soil. The remaining 18% of the property had some possibility for agricultural use. This 18% is located along Otter Point Road. He concluded that this property had very limited agricultural ability.

Mr. Kabel Atwall, retained by the Milt Gibson Memorial Society (for the applicant), stated that this property was included in the ALR because it was thought to have "class 3" soils based on erroneous mapping and, therefore, should not have been included in the ALR. He believed that if the land was kept in the ALR, Council would be using the ALR as a zoning tool.

Mr. Mike Swinburson, owner of the golf course property (for the applicant), handed out a map of the proposed changes to the golf course property. Mr. Swinburson stated that removing the land from the ALR would not be a loss of a golf course, but the golf course would change to meet the changing needs of golfers. He reviewed the three future changes to the golf course: 9 hole par 3, a driving range and mini golf. This plan would include additional parking. The proposed facility would be family oriented and affordable.

Mr. Tate spoke again to conclude the applicants' presentation and asked that the application be forwarded to the Land Reserve Commission.

Mayor Macgregor asked if there were any questions or comments from Council.

Councillor Dumont asked what would happen if CHR did not receive funding at this time. Mr. Tate responded that the CHR would hang on to the land until a funding opportunity arose in the future.

Councillor Marcus Farmer asked what the minimum land area requirement was. Mr. Tate stated that the minimum requirement was 6 acres.

Councillor Evans asked Mr. Swinburnson if the exclusion was not approved, what plans he had for the golf course. Mr. Swinburnson replied that it was well known that the property was for sale and that regardless if this project goes through, there will be changes to the golf course.

Mayor Macgregor commented on the restrictive covenant registered on the property. He noted that it was his understanding that it was registered in 1983, but that the *ALR Act* has precedent over the *Municipal Act*, and that the covenant is not operative unless the land is outside the ALR. If the land is removed from the ALR, the covenant will be in effect.

Mr. Tate confirmed that the legal opinion dated April 5, 2000, supported the Mayor's comments.

Mayor Macgregor outlined the covenant use restrictions as a) golf course, b) archery ranges, c) private tennis courts, d) racetracks, e) horse riding stables, f) swimming pools, or any other uses that the CRD or its successor authority may approve from time to time.

Robert Ellis of 6817 Beaton Road asked whether the extended care facility would be for Sooke residents. Mr. Tate explained that it would not be restricted to Sooke residents and there would be a central registry from which residents would be chosen.

Mr. John Yates of 1946 Murray Road questioned the centrality of the facility. Mr. Huizinga responded that there were no other central locations available.

Mrs. Martha Moore of 6551 Throup Road made statements in support of the application.

Mrs. Tate of 7797 Broom Hill Road asked what the result would be if Council did not endorse the application. Mr. Tate responded that it may be a few more years before the funding would be available again.

Mr. Jim Bently of 6821 Beaton made comments regarding the location of the building and its proximity to his residence.

Mayor Macgregor further explained the process and submission to the Land Reserve Commission and the necessary rezoning application.

Mrs. Betty Nestlebeck of 6872 Sealion Way made comments in support of the application.

Mrs. Doreen Genereux of 6091 Amethyst Road questioned the covenant and ALR designation.

Mrs. Ella Froese of 6017 Amethyst Way questioned the restrictive covenant and ALR designation.

Mr. Bill Bell of 2142 Townsend Road expressed his support for the seniors' facility and his opposition to the proposed site. Mr. Bell suggested that the sod farm property was a better site.

Ms. Joan Davies of 6829 Talc Place expressed her opposition to the application and the need for greenspace and walking paths in the community.

Mr. Mike Swinburson, owner of the John Phillips Memorial Golf Course, responded that the proposed changes to the golf course would improve services for youth and seniors, and leave green areas for wildlife through park dedication.

Mrs. Margot Swinburnson of 4520 Otter Point Road commented on the need for a long term care facility in the community and was in support of the application.

Mr. Dennis Murray of 1208 Wharf Street, Victoria, spoke on behalf of Old Age Pension Organisation Branch #88 of Sooke. Mr. Murray supported the application and commented on the need for a seniors' facility in Sooke.

Mr. Christopher Bing of 813 Goldstream Road spoke on behalf of the members of the golf club. Mr. Bing spoke against the application and argued that there were better sites for this development.

Mr. Mike Thomas of 7076 Wright Road spoke in support of the application and was in favour of the removal of the covenant.

Mr. Bing and Mr. Tate discussed other sites and the site selection process.

Mayor Macgregor stated that Council accepted the CRD's site studies.

Mrs. Dorothy Burrus of #2-6744 Ayre Road, a member of the OAPO Sooke Branch, spoke in support of the application and submitted a petition to Council in support of the application.

Mr. Huizinga made comments regarding the unsuitability of the land for agricultural purposes, changes in the golfing needs, and the urgency of the need of the facility.

Mrs. Milly Childers of 2242 Kemp Lake Road commented on the need of long term care in the community.

Mrs. Dorothy Lebrun of 6015 Amethyst Road questioned whether the facility was for Sooke residents, and commented on traffic impact. Mr. Mostaway responded that there would be increased traffic on Church and Throup Roads, but not on Amethyst Road. He also noted that a sidewalk would be built on Otter Point Road as a result of the development.

Mr. Bruce McMillan of 7044 Deerlepe Road commented on the covenant.

Mayor Macgregor asked if anyone wished to speak about something not yet spoken about.

Mr. Rob Ellis of 6817 Beaton Road spoke in opposition to the application. He commented on increased traffic, tax rates, decreased property values.

Mrs. Acreman, owner of the adjacent property, spoke in support of the application.

Mr. Ross Dawson of 6009 Amethyst spoke in opposition of the application.

Councillor John Farmer commended Mr. Day for his report and believed that it enabled Council to have more input in the process.

Councillor Marcus Farmer questioned what zoning the property would have once it was removed from the ALR. It was clarified that the zoning on the property would remain Agricultural and that the property would have to be rezoned.

Mayor Macgregor questioned whether golf courses were permitted in the ALR. Mr. Atwall responded that the golf course existed before the ALR designation of the property.

Councillor Evans commented on the need for seniors' housing, and questioned the future Council's vision for development. Mayor Macgregor replied that Council cannot control a future Council.

Councillor Dumont asked whether the application requires Council approval. Mr. French confirmed that this was so.

Councillor Stewart inquired whether the existing use was non-conforming. Mr. Day and Mr. Chee confirmed that it was and that the property required rezoning for this development. Mr. Day stated that it would be best to have a legal opinion to confirm if changes to the golf course could occur under the current zoning and the ALR designation.

Councillor Barry asked for confirmation that the application was for the exclusion of the west side of the golf course from the ALR and that the east side would stay in the ALR. This was confirmed. Councillor Barry asked where this left the property. Mr. Day responded that there were a couple of different perspectives to the situation. He stated that the applicant had only applied to remove the west side and that Council has the ability to negotiate whether it wants the whole property to come out of the ALR before it sends the application for exclusion. He suggested that Council talk to the property owner and talk to the Land Commission about process as well. The second issue was that the golf course is a non-conforming use in terms of zoning and the Land Commission.

Mr. Eakin commented on rural zoning. Mr. Chee stated that if the property is removed from the ALR it will remain zoned agricultural. Mr. Day stated that a Provincial enactment cannot change local zoning, only a local Council can do that. Mr. Atwall confirmed that the owner will have to apply to rezone the property in order to develop the land.

Mayor Macgregor stated "...it would be helpful to have a motion either supporting or otherwise this recommendation from staff".

Councillor Barry stated "I would like to move the recommendations and move this application to the Agricultural Land Commission for exclusion".

Mayor Macgregor asked "Seconded? Seconded by Councillor Stewart. Is there any further discussion? All in favour of the motion?".

Councillor John Farmer questioned tax benefit repayment and asked for a report from staff. Mr. Day commented that staff would research the issue.

Mayor Macgregor asked "Is there any other discussion on the motion?".

Councillor Marcus Farmer and Councillor Dumont commented on their support of the removal from ALR because it is not agricultural land.

Mayor Macgregor asked "Is there any further discussion? Are you ready for the question? All in favour of the motion, opposed, carried. We will forward a resolution to the Agricultural Land Commission supporting the removal of the parcel on the west side of Otter Point Road from the Agricultural Land Reserve".

PM-1 Public Meeting - ALR Application: Application to remove 2209 Townsend Road from the Agricultural Land Reserve (Glencar Consultants Inc. for John & Loretta Acreman)

Mayor Macgregor invited Mrs. Acreman (applicant) to address Council.

Mrs. Acreman informed Council that she had owned the property since 1962. It was not a workable farm and she had moved her farming operation to Campbell River. She would like to subdivide the property to allow her daughter to remain as resident in the house and to sell the acreage. The property was placed in the ALR in 1981.

Mr. Sinclair Philip of 1528 Whiffen Spit Road submitted a letter to Council. He advised that he belongs to an agricultural organization and is the former owner of Malahat Farm. He believes that products from small farms are selling well and that farms and tourism bring about an increase in employment.

Councillor Barry enquired whether Malahat Farm would be workable without the Bed and Breakfast business. Mr. Philip replied that it would not.

Mrs. Acreman stated that the cost of hay for 75 head of cattle is considerable and that raised beds would be required on 17 acres in order to grow produce. Animals are afflicted with foot rot because of the mud. She stated that the property was for sale.

Mr. Bob Acreman of 6837 West Coast Road supported the application.

Mr. Ross Dawson of 6009 Amethyst Way opposed both applications.

Mr. Jordan Walsh of 6025 Amethyst Way opposed the application and thought that long term planning was required.

Mr. George Butcher of 2018 Penang Road opposed the application. He thought that the applicants are attempting to increase the value of their property by removing it from the ALR.

Mr. Stan Eakin of 7215 Austins Place supported the application, as it is unfair to landowners to use the Land Commission to zone land for green space.

Mr. Jeff Bunting of 6518 Throup Road supported the application, as he never made a profit as a farmer in 14 years.

Ms. Barb McKay of 2225 Townsend Road commented on her concern for green space.

Ms. Marg Germigan of the Cowichan Valley, and of the Farm Folk/City Folk Society, was opposed to the application and commented on the importance of farming on the Island.

Mr. Robert Liptrot of 8750 West Coast Road opposed the application as he successfully runs a honeybee farm and believes agricultural land is important.

Mr. John Brohman of 6621 Sooke Road supported the application. He believes that farmland is a burden in the middle of town and Sooke needs park space and residential areas.

Mr. Steve Isbister of 6020 Amethyst Way opposed the application as it is a priority to protect the natural environment. He believed that Council would be setting a precedent for further land removal from the ALR.

Ms. Diane Clark of Kaltasin Road opposed the application as green space is valuable.

Kelly Burns of 2273 Church Road opposed the application. He believed that the land held value as agricultural land as there are improved farming methods available.

Mayor Macgregor announced a five minutes recess at 9:06 pm.

The Director of Finance left the meeting.

Mr. Dave Parsons of 2727 Phillips road opposed the application. He operates a 10 acre farm and believes that farms have to adapt. He suggested that Council formulate a set of criteria for determining support for ALR applications.

Mr. Derek Lammy of West Coast Road opposed the application.

Dana of West Coast Road opposed the application as she thought tourism is important.

Mayor Macgregor called three times for further submissions to Council. Hearing none, he closed this Public Meeting at 9:25 pm.

Councillor Barry asked Mrs. Acreman if she had attempted to sell the property. Mrs. Acreman explained that she wanted to subdivide the property in order for her daughter to have the residence. She has not attempted to sell it because it is not farmland.

Mayor Macgregor asked if she had attempted to subdivide the property without removing it from the ALR. Mrs. Acreman replied that the Land Commission has informed her that it was better to remove the complete property from the ALR before it was subdivided.

Councillor Dumont stated that the Land Commission had a set of criteria for assessing agricultural land and believed that the Land Commission should make that decision. Councillor Evans sympathized with the applicant and suggested that it was an option that the District of Sooke purchase the property in order to keep it as parkland. This would require a municipal tax increase.

Mayor Macgregor stated that the ALR was not the best method for preserving for green space. He thought that there were three options: the community purchase the property for green space; green space be preserved through zoning and subdivision process; or to rely on the Land Commission to determine its use. If the land is removed from the ALR, it does not preclude it being retained for green space. He asked whether the retention of the land in the ALR meets the objectives of the Local Area Plan or whether this would be better served by ownership by the District or by rezoning/subdivision.

Councillor Marcus Farmer stated that the decision whether the land is agricultural should be made by the Land Commission. The land reserve does not provide green space, which should be protected through zoning or park dedication.

Moved by Councillor Dumont, seconded to support the application to remove 2209 Townsend Road from the Agricultural Land Reserve.

PM-2 Public Meeting - ALR Application: Application to remove 2273 Church Road from the Agricultural Land Reserve (Douglas Worthington)

Mayor Macgregor opened this Public Meeting at 9:37 pm

Mayor Macgregor invited Mr. Worthington (applicant) to speak to Council.

Mr. Worthington of 2273 Church Road stated that he has owned this property for 51 years and various attempts at farming have not been successful. He applied in 1984 to remove it from the ALR. He stated that property is for sale.

Mr. Ross Dawson of 6009 Amethyst Way opposed the application.

Mr. Jordan Walsh of 6025 Amethyst Way stated that the only way to protect the property was to keep in it the ALR.

Mr. Robert Liptrot opposed the application and encouraged the public to write to the Land Commission.

Mr. George Butcher of 2018 Penang Road made comments opposing the application.

Councillor Barry stated that the vote on previous ALR items was not unanimous and that these were not easy decisions.

Mr. Don Lassey of 7163 Cedarbrook Place opposed the application. He stated that the property was zoned agricultural and there would be further meetings for any rezoning of the property. Mr. Steve Isbister of 6020 Amethyst Way opposed the application.

Mayor Macgregor noted that the property would have to go through the rezoning process to remove it from Agricultural zoning.

Mr. Philip asked for a referendum.

Mr. Walsh stated that Council was not supporting what the public wants.

Ms. Barb McKay asked that the application be put on hold as Council was new and inexperienced.

Mayor Macgregor called three times for further submissions. Hearing none, he closed the meeting at 10:04

Moved by Councillor Evans, seconded to not support the application to remove 2273 Church Road from the Agricultural Land Reserve.

b) Juan de Fuca Water Distribution Commission

PUBLIC INPUT MEETING:

Development Permit Application SDP-01-00 to construct a 30,000 gallon propane storage tank with footings and foundation for bulk sales at 1965 Goodridge Road - Lot 4, Section 65, Plan 4444, Sooke District

Mr. Chee advised that the subject property was currently zoned for industrial use and Council can only consider the Development Permit guidelines:

- 1. Size and shape of the buildings
- 2. Adverse impact of noise, light, odour and any undesirable visual effects
- 3. Storage and garbage disposal facilities
- 4. High quality of sign design and construction

Mayor Macgregor acknowledged that the applicant, Ms. Susan Borden, was in attendance.

Councillor Dumont asked whether any environmental protection requirements were considered. Fire Chief Kelsey responded that as propane is a gas, secondary containment is not required.

The applicant explained that the site has been used for revalving and recycling tanks. Drivers and other employees have Provincial certification in dangerous goods and propane dispensing.

Councillor John Farmer asked whether the tanks are purged on the property. The applicant replied that new tanks do not require purging. Councillor John Farmer asked if the Sooke Firefighters would require more training. The Fire Chief replied that firefighters would be taking hazardous goods response training this fall as part of the regular training program.

Councillor John Farmer asked about a timeframe for construction. The applicant responded that the operation could be functioning in 6 months.

The applicant clarified that the size of the tank would be 4 times larger than the tank at the Payless Gas Station, and three times larger than the tank behind the Fire Hall.

Councillor Marcus Farmer asked what kind of guarantee there was that landscaping and screening will be put in place. Mr. Day explained that the *Local Government Act* authorizes the requirement of a financial guarantee.

The applicant explained that the hours of business would be regular business hours, 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. There will be no building on the site as propane tanks cannot be stored inside, however a lean-to structure may be constructed in the future.

Mr. Day reminded Council that the zone of the property is Industrial and Council can only address the four issues identified in guidelines for Development Permits.

Mayor Macgregor invited members of the public to address Council.

Mrs. Lillian Money of 5574 Medberry Close expressed her concerns about the neighbouring residential and campground property, health effects, safety, and the need for an industrial park.

Steve McNaughton of 5577 Medberry Close commented on the inconsistencies of the Local Area Plan and the Official Community Plan. He noted Provincial Gas Safety Branch requirements and asked to review the local emergency response plan. Mr. McNaughton advised that at one point he had to vacate his home because of the smell from the property. The applicant advised that this was an isolated incident where ethyl mercaptan gas escaped and that propane was not present.

Deputy Chief Sorensen advised that the proposal is referred to the Gas Safety Branch after the Development Permit is issued. Fire Chief Kelsey stated that the current Emergency Response Plan is reviewed regularly and is currently not site specific.

Ms. Gwen Griff of the Society for the Protection of Ayum Creek expressed her concern on the impact on Ayum Creek Park and potential fires.

Ms. Manley, a past president of the Society for the Protection of Ayum Creek, expressed concern about access and egress from the Park in the case of an emergency and traffic hazard of trucks turning left on the Highway. She stated that Council has a responsibility for due diligence and should consider the Fire Department's plan.

Ms. Gail Nash of 5497 Medberry Close was concerned about highway access to Sooke if an accident occurred at this site.

Mr. Sinclair Phillip of 1528 Whiffin Spit Road asked Council to consider an environment and safety risk impact study, an alternate route for an emergency response plan, and an extra left hand turn lane on Sooke Road.

An unknown member of the public thought that the applicant should consider the possibility of vandalism. The applicant suggested that video surveillance, secure fences and lighting could be used. Sensors could be used to warn of propane leaks.

Mayor Macgregor advised the public that Council would likely consider the Development Permit at the next Council meeting in two weeks time.

Mr. Chee advised that the Development Permit is issued before application for a Building Permit. Council cannot impose any restrictions other than those listed in the guidelines for Development Permits. Safety requirements are considered at the Building Permit stage.

D-1 Colin Eckstrand, Spiritual Assembly of the Baha'is of Sooke, gift presentation

Mr. Eckstrand thanked Council for the opportunity to address Council and introduced Mr. Don Brown. Mr. Brown introduced the Assembly and expressed interest in the opportunity to work with Council to share ideas of community development initiatives.

D-2 Joel Ussery & Don Watmough, Park Planners, CRD Parks, Draft Management Plan for Sooke Hills Wilderness and Mount Wells Regional Parks

Mr. Ussery presented the draft Management Plan which sets out two main priorities, the first being protection of the water supply and the second being a phased approached to opening the proposed parks. Councillor Dumont asked whether or not this was the final plan and Mr. Ussery explained that it was the third part of the consultation process and that there would be further consultations with the public and consulting agencies. Councillor Dumont inquired about accessibility for handicapped and disabled persons and Mr. Ussery explained that it was CRD policy to bring in handicapped access where possible. CRD Parks is requesting comment from Council by January 15, 2000.

D-3 Ms. Marnie Benner, Marnie Treasures

Ms. Benner responded to Mr. Limshue's letter of October 23, 2000. She advised that the square footage of the existing building is actually 750 ft² and not 1224 ft². In regards to parking, she stated that the town study shows 15 m is required for road dedication, cars do not park on the right-of-way, and cars do not have to back out on to the highway. She feels that she is being singled-out as Sooke has not addressed other properties where cars back onto highway and that do not have required parking spaces. She had put in parking on her property to reduce liability. She read her letter of November 9, 2000 and offered to have a restrictive covenant placed on her property.

Ms. Benner advised that the Fire Inspector inspected her property on February 17, 1999 and the only requirement was a fire extinguisher by the front door. On June 6, 2000 the Fire Chief attended the business and advised that she needed emergency exit lights and two hard-wired smoke detectors, and may require a one-hour fire separation, which was up to the Building Inspector. She stated that two days later she spoke to Mr. Day who advised her that the Building Inspector did not make inspections on requisition. There has been no action or communication on the part of the Building Inspector or Fire Department on what she is supposed to change.

Ms. Benner stated that the location of septic and drainage field is of no concern to parking. She is not aware of any near misses. She advised that she wants to pursue this matter further but the suggested additional costs may be too exorbitant for her. She questioned the Official Community Plan and what development permit is required. She stated that parking requires further discussion. The October letter is the first communication since her rezoning application and she was unaware of what the requirements were for parking until the October letter. She knows that she opened illegally and it was a mistake and she asked for cooperation and compassion. She has checked for other business locations and found none that were suitable. She asked that if Council decided to close her shop she be allowed to remain open until December 24, 2000.

Councillor John Farmer commented that the time that was given to Ms. Benner was quite favourable and that some of the zoning and parking issues had already been brought to her attention in June of 1999.

Bylaw Enforcement was first in contact with Ms. Benner on June 10, 1999 concerning the business and the zoning of the property.

Mr. Day advised that he met with Ms. Benner in June 2000. He had asked that she submit a rezoning application and told her that she would need to show that the land use was suitable for the site. He advised her at the time that her biggest hurdle would be highways' approval. Mr. Day had asked the Fire Chief to attend to site to give Ms. Benner an idea of what would be involved to meet Fire Codes. Council had given special consideration to Ms. Benner on June 12, 2000 and allowed her to continue operating her business until her rezoning application could be considered. Highways advised of requirements for rezoning in October 2000.

Mr. Limshue advised that he attended the site on October 13, 2000 and explained the process of a rezoning application, the required amendment to the Official Community Plan, parking requirements and safety concerns. Mr. Limshue advised on the limited area available for parking due to the locations of the septic field and drainage field.

Mayor Macgregor asked how many parking spaces would need to be provided if the property was zoned commercial. Mr. Limshue advised that the Zoning Bylaw determines parking requirements and Ms. Benner would need eight spaces (or less depending on floor space), plus two spaces for residential.

Moved by Councillor John Farmer, seconded to support the application to remove 2197 Otter Point Road and legally described as Parcel A (DD143706I), Section 24, Sooke District, except Plans 5572, 11961, 27456, 40462, VIP52601 and VIP59223 (lying east of Otter Point Road) from the Agricultural Land Reserve.

Councillor Marcus Farmer commented that no one has come forward with a reason why the property should remain in the ALR.

Councillor Dumont commented that he did not like that the LRC drew a line designating agricultural land whether or not the land was appropriate.

Mayor Macgregor commented that he did not think it is appropriate to confuse land use and zoning with the appropriate designation of the land. Council has to deal with the public concern and consider:

- 1. is it suitable for the land to remain in the ALR;
- 2. that the application is different from the school or the sod farm applications;
- 3. that Council is not dealing with wholesale removal of property from the ALR.

Councillor Evans reported that she met with Ms. Elida Peers concerning the Millennium Book signing. Councillor Evans and Ms. Peers have arranged for the service clubs of Sooke to nominate people to sign the book and Council to draw from those names the person to sign the book last. Councillor Evans noted that Council receives opinions on the issue from many other persons than those in the room.

Mayor Macgregor noted that Council does not have a "hidden agenda" to remove property from the ALR.

Ms. Mara Jernigan questioned why then did Council approve the Worthington and Acreman application?

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Councillor Evans and Councillor Barry noted they voted against the Worthington applications.

Councillor John Farmer stated that the LRC gave its reasons for removing the Worthington and Acreman properties from the ALR.

Councillor Barry noted that Council does not have any control over the LRC. Further, no one knows what Mr. Swinburnson wants to do with the property other than a par 3 golf course.
