Mayor's Report Jan. 22/07

Jan. 9 & 11

I attended the Finance and Admin Committee meeting, minutes will follow.

Jan. 10

I attended the inaugural CRD board meeting. We adopted the bylaw for borrowing from MFA the amount of \$617,101.00 for our new fire truck. We passed a resolution for the Juan de Fuca Electoral Area to support the notice of an alternative approval process in relation to the CRD bylaw 3401 for the Sooke Region Historical Society and established Feb. 26, 2007 as the deadline for submissions.

Jan. 16

I attended the BC Transit commission meeting where we approved the 2007/08 budget of \$74.39 million. The projected increase in ridership is 7% and Sooke will see an increased in service in the fall. I am told that ridership on our community bus is sporadic and I will have firmer numbers at next months meeting.

Jan. 17

I attended the Regional Water Board Commission meeting. As of Dec. 15 the reservoir was full and is still spilling. The estimate in damage from the windstorm in the water shed is over \$1 million. Many roads are impassable and the commission and staff will determined how the clean up will be handled...i.e.: remove fallen tress by logging or leave to rot. The commission will be applying for financial assistance from the Province and the Federal governments, similar what has been given to Stanley Park.

Jan. 18

I attended the Seaparc meeting. We re-elected Ken-Pungente as chair and will hold election for vice-chair at the next meeting when a full commission is present. We approved the fees for the Sooke Fine Art show this summer and discussed the budget.

Mark Poppe of Townsend Road questioned the proposed layout of the parking and how it will coincide with the proposed redevelopment of Townsend Road.

Gail Hall, Sooke River Road read and submitted her statement expressing opposition to the bylaw and stated concerns with the application and process.

Fred VonIlberg, Tara Place expressed concerns with site coverage and parking. Mr. VonIlberg asked Council to hold the application.

Stuart Cummings of Charters Road explained that rezoning defines what land can be used for, not a specific development project.

Mayor Evans called three times for further submissions. Hearing none, she closed the public hearing at 7:13 pm.

PH-2 Bylaw No. 275, Official Community Plan Amendment Bylaw (86-18) and Bylaw No. 276, Zoning Amendment Bylaw (270-2)

Mayor Evans called three times for further submissions. Hearing none, she closed the public hearing at 7:14 pm.

PH-3 Bylaw No. 277, Zoning Amendment Bylaw (270-3)

Mayor Evans called three times for further submissions. Hearing none, she closed the public hearing at 7:15 pm.

PH-4 Bylaw No. 279, Official Community Plan Amendment Bylaw (86-19) Bylaw No. 280, Zoning Amendment Bylaw (270-4)

Ardiel Wickheim, applicant, read and submitted his statement addressing natural noise barriers and dust control.

Gary Coles, Meota Drive stated he is the adjacent property owner and is developing a 15-lot subdivision and expressed his concerns for the 5 lots that border this property. Mr Cole questioned how long is the quarry proposed for and what happens if the property is sold after it is rezoned?

Terry McLean, Church Road expressed support and made reference to the residents near the quarry at Bear Mountain.

Jose Vieira, Sooke Road stated he is the neighbouring property and supports the application. Mr. Vieira commented on the improvements made over the years on the subject property.

Dori Fedorov, Sooke Road expressed concerns about water quality for wells in the area, increased traffic, noise, dust, pollution and the environmental impact on the land. Ms. Fedorov expressed concerns with future development on the property and stated that industrial zones do not belong in a residential area.

Stuart Cummings, Charters expressed the need for a rock quarry in Sooke.

Robert Liptrot of West Coast Road expressed his opposition for the proposal. Mr. Liptrot expressed concerns with increased traffic, heavy trucks impacting Sooke Road and urged Council to seek more professional advise on the environmental impact. Mr. Liptrot commented on Sooke's scenic recourses and was concerned that tourism, Bed and Breakfasts and the Galloping Goose would all be affected.

John Martin of Sooke River Road stated he was in favour of a rock quarry and stated it would be a benefit to the Municipality.

Gail Hall, Soke River Road read and submitted her statement expressing support for the bylaws but had concerns regarding the process.

Gord Cranton, Ayum Road expressed concerns about his property value decreasing as a result of the quarry operation.

Michael Savage, Blythwood Road supports the application and stated Mr. Wickheim has a sense of stewardship to the land and creeks and has improved his property substantially. Mr. Savage addressed the issue of trucks along the road; tandem trucks would not be going back and forth along Sooke road instead local trucks would be servicing the area. Mr. Savage stated this would be a local product and would create local jobs.

Neil Smith, Brule Drive, owner of HHS Drilling and Blasting expressed support for the bylaws and address concerns with mining procedures and stated that a Mining Permit would satisfy all concerns. He urged Council to support the creation of businesses in Sooke.

Ellen Lewers, Sooke Road expressed her support and commented on water quality, dust, blasting and traffic concerns.

John Ross of Victoria expressed opposition and questioned the descriptions in the maps and text. Mr. Ross questioned where the water would come from and where the water would go after being polluted in the process of mining. Mr. Ross noted the all waterways in the area and that all the homes in the area are on wells. Mr. Ross stated that noise barriers will not work and inquired about the covenant.

Janny and John Rose, Sooke Road expressed support and stated that Mr. Wickheim has been a considerate neighbour and always given warning when blasting.

Ed Taje, Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources gave an overview of the processing and provisions of a Mining Permit application.

Gail Hall, Sooke River Road restated her opposition to the proposed bylaws.

Gary Cole, Meota Drive questioned the public hearing process and asked, what is the duration of the quarry operation?

Dori Fedorov, Sooke Road repeated her opposition and concern s for water supplies at risk.

Robert Liptrot, West Coast Road further stated his concerns as to water quality and environmental issues during the process of mining.

Fred Vonliberg, Tara Place expressed dissatisfaction with the public hearing chair and asked Council to check the existing bylaws.

Ellen Lewers, Sooke Road commented further on development in the area and the improvements Mr. Wickheim has done to the subject property.

Therefore the District of Sooke respectfully requests the Union of BC Municipalities urgently convene a meeting of concerned municipalities to form a working group that will:

- a. be sufficiently resourced to undertake an immediate review of the impact of this agreement on municipalities, and
- b. immediately upon conclusion of this review undertake negotiations with the Provincial Government to have TILMA amended so that it is in alignment with current municipal legislation and protects municipalities from the consequences of this agreement."

PH-1 Bylaw No. 293, Zoning Amendment Bylaw (270-9) - 6402 and 6418 Sooke Road

Marlaina Elliott provided an overview of the application.

Doug Baxter, project manager for the Lighthouse Lane Estates reviewed the application and described the density, riparian area, and Smart Growth concepts for the development.

Jennifer Dodd, Vice President of Drennan Townhouses, expressed her concerns of increased traffic from the original proposed 30 units to the amended zone of 100 plus units. Ms. Dodd asked if access to the property would be on Drennan Road or Sooke Road. Ms. Dodd questioned the intention of amending the zoning for the purpose of density and questioned the drainage for on-site retention.

Norman Amirault, Bellvista Place, asked what would be developed and expressed concern for the access to the development and how it would impact Bellvista Place.

Fred Von Ilberg, Tara Place, stated that the advertisement for the public hearing was incorrect and that the public hearing should be cancelled. Mr. Von Ilberg expressed concerns as to increased traffic and stated that approval is subject to Ministry of Transportation.

Doug TitchKosky, Belvista Place, expressed his concern as to the impact on the corner of Belvista and access to the development off Sooke Road.

Gail Hall, Sooke River Road, commented on the content of the zoning amendment bylaw and asked about Bylaw No. 85, *Development Application Bylaw, 2002* not being used by Council. Ms. Hall expressed concerns with the incorrect notice, strata subdivisions and wetland liabilities.

Tim Trytten, Drennan Road, expressed concerns as to the application being rushed, more information required, and access and safety concerns.

Marlaina Elliott explained the zoning amendment procedure and that the applicant cannot create a conceptual design until they know what zoning is applicable.

Rin Rapp, Drennan Road, expressed concerns regarding receiving the amended notice with incorrect statement on April 2, 2007, not knowing what the development will be and managing traffic without changing infrastructure.

Bruce Milton, Golledge Avenue, commented on considering lower density for a Multi Family development.

Herb Haldane, Sooke Road, commented that the zoning was intended to increase densities within the Sewer Specified Area.

Brenda Ryan, Charters Road, raised concerns of three rezoning applications for high density in the same neighbourhood, which will impact traffic and pedestrian safety within school radiuses.

The Director of Planning and myself attended a workshop in Victoria put on by the BC Film Commission. Issues that were discussed were availability of locations for film crews and infrastructure throughout the region for studios. We came away with some good ideas and contacts.

May 23

I attended the CRD Regional Planning Committee meeting where there was a very close vote on weather to support the recommendation to the board for the interim amendment to the RGS. The biggest issue in the amendment is the change to the urban containment boundary for the Highlands. They first made their request (which was supported by a Council resolution) in Mar of 06 and they are still waiting. If the board passes this recommendation then it goes to public hearing on June 28, then to the province and won't be finalized until Sept. 07 a full 18 months since their request. If it doesn't pass at the board then it waits for a full review of the RGS in 2008 with completion in 2009, a full 3 years after their request. This delay if why it is very important that we in Sooke make sure our urban containment boundary and context statement are done right for future growth.

May 24

- property lines
- view lines
- site access
- existing creeks and park connections
- site topography
- possible development placements

Mr. Williams summarized planning and urban design and thanked Council.

Mr. Alilbhai emphasized social, economic and environmentally responsible development and affordable ground oriented proposal.

Stuart Cummings, Charters Road, expressed his support for the bylaw.

Dana Lajeunesse, Grant Road, expressed his support for the bylaw and urged Council to consider third reading.

Marilyn Clarkson, Amethyst Way, submitted her statement expressing her concerns and opposition to the bylaw.

PI-1 2007 Annual Municipal Meeting – 2007 Annual Municipal Report

Ms. Sprinkling gave a powerpoint presentation on the 2007 Annual Municipal Meeting to consider the 2007 Annual Report.

Mayor Evans called for public comment and questions on the 2007 Annual Municipal Report.

Fred Von Ilberg, Tara Place, stated his concerns that the financial statements to not reflect the true status of the sewer funds, ie. transfers between operating and capital funds, and that the core sewer area must bear all the costs of the sanitary sewer system.

Mr. Devana explained that the deficit resulting in the Sewer Capital Funds is \$46,462 and in the Sewer Operating Funds is \$2,944 and that all transfers from operating to the sewer accounts have been repaid; the \$88,000 was set up as deferred revenue as it is being held by MFA. The statements presented are an accurate representation of accounts as of December 31, 2006.

Gail Hall, Sooke River Road asked if Council was considering establishing the "whistle-blower" policy recommended by the District of Sooke auditors. Mayor Evans stated that Council has not discussed the policy yet.

Gail Hall requested an explanation of the sections "Comparative figures" and "Transfer to Sewer Capital Funds" as to the transfer of sewer funds. Mr. Devana stated that

approximately \$2.2M was transferred from operating to sewer accounts as interim financing for the sewer project; the full amount was paid back upon receipt of the sewer grant funds. Mr. Devana stated that the audited statements reflect true account transactions and that we are awaiting release of the final grant funds.

Mr. Devana stated that the \$495,000 land purchase for the sewer project was funded by the General Operating fund and is set up as a municipal asset on the Balance Sheet.

Ken Van, Phillips Road commented that he felt that it was wrong that the property owners outside the sewer specified area did not get an opportunity to vote on the purchase of the property.

Mayor Evans stated that the Council of the day felt that the property purchase was of benefit to the whole community.

Gail Hall acknowledged that the property is a benefit to everyone, but that the sewer and borrowing bylaws states that all costs are to be borne by the sewer specified area.

Ken Van asked about the re-building of the roads after the sewer construction was completed.

Councillor Armour left the meeting at 6:30 pm.

Councillor Dumont stated that the roads were not to be re-built, but to bring the roads back to standard after installation. Councillor Kasper stated that some roads, such as Townsend Road, were not in good shape before installation that it was decided not to repair the entire road.

Gail Hall asked if the contracts CREST and Mainroad would be changed as a result of recent negotiations. Mayor Evans stated that the contract with Mainroad is locked in until 2008, but that because CREST was an inter-municipal shared cost, the costs may change. Chief Kelsey stated that the CREST system works well for the District of Sooke.

Councillor Kasper noted that one of the 2007 objectives was to review the municipal contracts and agreements.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:35 pm.

PH-1 Bylaw No. 313, Zoning Amendment Bylaw (270-16)

Marlaina Elliott provided an overview of the proposed application to change the zoning on the property located at 1927, 1923, 1919 Maple Avenue South from Village Residential 1 Zone (R-1) to Medium Density Multi Family Residential Zone (RM-3); and 6881 Galaxie Drive from Mixed Small Lot Residential Zone (RS-2) to Medium Density Multi Family Residential Zone (RM-3).

Renata Tilly, Maple Avenue South, expressed her concern of increased noise on Maple Avenue South and the impact of increased traffic on Sooke Road.

Lois Gardner, Kennedy Street, expressed concerns with the Regional Context Statement in regards to high density in residential areas and stated that the developer should provide a traffic light at West Coast Road and Maple Avenue.

Ms. Elliott explained that the District of Sooke met with the Ministry of Transportation two weeks ago and they are investigating the need for a traffic light at the West Coast Road and Maple Avenue South intersection.

Council questioned the alignment and road dedication of Galaxie Road in regard to the adjacent property owners submission dated July 31, 2007.

Laurie Wallace, Harbour View Road, commented on the road allowance proposed for the properties combined together and explained that they are all separate property owners.

Kathy Ross, Powliuk Crescent, asked if Galaxie Road would be connected to Maple Avenue South.

Bob Young, Maple Avenue South, asked for more details on the proposed development.

Mayor Evans explained that this is a rezoning of the property and that the proposed zone would allow twenty dwelling units per acre.

Ms. Tilly, expressed concerns of increased sewer services in the area.

Mayor Evans called three times for further submissions. Hearing none, she closed the public input portion at 7:17 pm.

Ellen Lewers, Sooke Road, asked if property owners who are not included in the identified areas were notified by mail. Ms. Lewers stated her concerns and questions with the process of the Regional Context Statement, the Official Community Plan review and water services. Ms. Lewers expressed her vision of Smart Growth.

Ms. Elliott explained that legislation does not require property owners to be notified and that properties in the UGA would apply for a water servicing agreement.

Mayor Evans explained the Capital Regional District process for accepting the District of Sooke's Official Community Plan review with the Regional Context Statement.

Philip Ney, Connie Road, expressed his concerns with the Regional Growth Strategy and stated that inconsistencies make Sooke unique and diversified. Mr. Ney questioned the Capital Regional District's authority.

Dave McClimon, Dixon Road, stated his concerns with proposed changes by various governing bodies and questioned how it would affect family property.

Richard Jones, Possession Point, stated his concerns with rising real estate prices when establishing containment areas and that the services and infrastructure cannot support the developments.

Gail Hall, Sooke River Road, stated her opposition to the bylaws and read and submitted her concerns as to the clarity and content of the proposed bylaw.

Mr. Ney stated concerns with the Capital Regional District interest in the Context statement and asked Council what facts were available for establishing the projected growth for Sooke.

Mayor Evans invited Mr. Ney to visit staff during office hours.

Herb Haldane, applicant, explained the population in Sooke exceeds the ratio for Doctors available for servicing patients in Sooke and that building a four story building is affordable.
